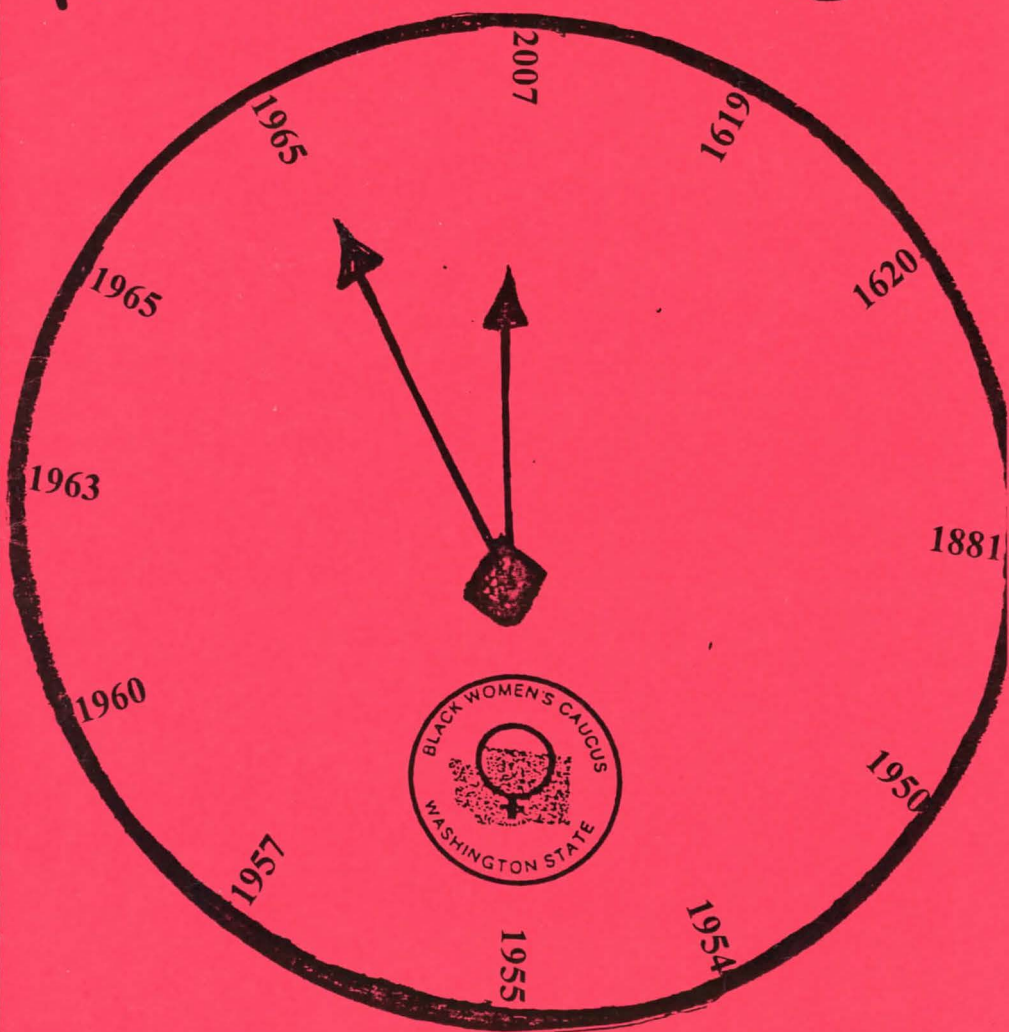

- 1619 First record of Black man's presence in the English Colonies. Africans first came to the English Colonies involuntarily, to work out their freedom as indentured servants.
- 1620 First slave ship landed in America
- 1881 Tuskegee Institute founded
- 1950 Dr Ralph Bunche awarded Nobel Peace prize for his work in ending the war between Israel and the Arab Nations
- 1954 Supreme Court bans segregation in schools. Brown vs. Board of Education
- 1955 Rosa Parks, a negro seamstress seated in the Black section of a bus refused to give up her seat to a male white man
- 1955 The beginning of the bus boycott in Montgomery.
- 1957 Althea Gibson Wimbledon champion.
- 1960 Civil Rights Act signed by President Eisenhower.
- 1963 March on Washington
- 1965 1st march on Selma Alabama
- 1965 Watts, Los Angeles Burns.
