

Statistical studies have been made of lung cancer among other occupational groups besides smelter workers. Enterline and McKiever of the U. S. Public Health Services in 1963 reported abnormally high lung cancer deaths among:

Blacksmiths, carpenters, automobile mechanics, metal moulders, painters, paper hangers, plumbers, pipefitters, stationary engineers, tailors, furriers, tinsmiths, coppersmiths, sheet metal workers, primary metal industrial workers. An occupation having one of the highest lung cancer death rates was that of elevator operators.

It is clear, I think that questions of lung cancer and occupation are, indeed, unresolved and there are no simple answers.
