Dear Mr. Webb:

I am writing this letter to you on behalf of ASARCO Incorporated in order to respond to certain statements attributed to you by the Morning News Tribune in an article published on May 3, 1990. A copy of that article is attached.

Your statements regarding disagreements between EPA and Asarco and Asarco's "refusal" to install monitoring wells comes as news to us. Since submittal of the draft feasibility study to EPA in mid-January, we have heard nothing by way of comment or criticism despite repeated inquiries from us. We have not been informed as to any disagreements EPA might have with regard to the FS, nor has EPA requested any new monitoring wells. Moreover, the only suggestion with regard to "deferring" anything was my renewed suggestion that Asarco proceed with demolition while the details of the feasibility study are being worked out. That makes much more sense than the way EPA is currently conducting things, which is to let the Tacoma smelter stand in an increasing state of disrepair while EPA tries to figure out what Had Asarco been allowed to move forward with demolition, the site would now be ready for remedial action. As it is, once the process does begin, it could take over a year to get the site ready to begin remedial action.
