INTRODUCTION

The lists contained in this work are the result of many hours of labor by numbers of individuals throughout the state. Several years ago when the Washington State Library organized a SCAN advisory group, one of the needs determined by the group was a list of holdings of libraries throughout the state which would assist interlibrary loan and reference staffs in finding special holdings of library organizations.

A questionnaire was developed and distributed throughout the state to many types of libraries. Of those libraries known to have specialized materials including special indexes most responded. Those not responding received direct requests.

Later when the first preliminary draft was completed a number of the larger lending agencies were asked for additions and corrections. These were included in the text.

Caroline Gallacci of the Washington State Historical Society indexed the responses by institution and special index held.

Included also are some responses from several libraries in the state which perform much of the interlibrary loan work. It is hoped that as time passes others will wish to contribute, for additions and corrections are welcomed.

Special indexes include: a card index of articles on early airplanes from magazines such as \underline{Flight} , $\underline{Aeroplane}$, and $\underline{Aerial\ Age}$ beginning in 1900 period.

Collection is especially strong in pioneer aviation. There is good coverage on the aircraft industry, especially the Boeing Company. Subjects include heliocopters, aircraft engines, dirigibles, airports and aviation statistics.
