Fri. in Claude Franklin's car with friends up San Simeon highway visiting the famous Henry Miller near Big Sur, dining on the wharf at Monterey ~~containing~~ with the fantastic Greeks Jan Verda in his fantastic pink carriage stable studio; back to Santa Maria; next day spent in queuing as much as possible of the suppressed Henry Miller literature. Sunday, beach at Pismo, and finally off alone again on Monday to here. Weather exceptionally hot until today. Have already done one portrait, and am finding wealth of source material at Stanford Library for illustration of juvenile which I will be working on at once for Random House. Please send mine here until further notice.

Almost drove with Mrs. Seaman to New York, instead of coming here. Trip postponed at last minute because of school complications - As you say - cooler weather better,
