You may be right, that I can come and get it. I would like nothing better than to be with you all - in the newly painted house - it sounds like the last word in elegance.

I have ordered my trunk and one box to be sent on to you, freight, from San Luis Obispo. The trunk will not be crated and can be put in a car, also the box. For the present. I am leaving other bags with friends in L.A. until I find out if I will be able to use any of the things in them. The letter from the Red Cross was a last minute job to illustrate a Peace Buck story.

for Joe Red & News. I guess its the same story  
as that Child Life rejected. I'm sending them the  
pictures today.

Edmund is here at this school. He was due  
to have his final citizenship papers almost  
a year and a half ago, but they are  
still held up. Now he is classified IA, so  
when he gets the papers he'll be in the  
army or visa versa.

Last Saturday I crashed the gates at  
the private residence of Walter C. Arensberg  
who has one of the well known collections  
of Modern Art, and Central American Pre-
