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### FIRST READING OF ORDINANCES:

Ordinance No. 19867

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Authorizing the transfer of the sum of \$9,109 from the Contingency Fund No. 143 to the General Fund for the purpose of providing money to employ a full time secretary to the Beautification Committee. 214

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Earl Mittelstaedt, Finance Director, explained to Council that this ordinance would enable the Planning Department to implement the position and the following ordinance would take care of the establishment of the position itself. He suggested that this ordinance and the following one be considered jointly.

Ordinance No. 19868

Amending the pay and compensation plan to add the position of Beautification Planner.

Ron Skaggs, Personnel Department, explained the duties of the position and stated that one of the duties of the Beautification Planner would be secretary to the Committee.

Mr. Schroeder moved to amend Ordinance No. 19867 by changing the words "full time secretary" to "Beautification Planner" wherever they appear in the ordinance to correspond to the wording in Ordinance No. 19868. Seconded by Mr. Moss. Voice vote was taken and carried.

After considerable discussion, Ordinance No. 19867, as amended, and Ordinance No. 19868 were set over for final reading next week.

Ordinance No. 19869 Amending the pay and compensation plan to add the position of Police Property Clerk.

Mr. Skaggs explained to Council that this is merely a housekeeping Ordinance and involves no additional salary or personnel.

The Ordinance was set over for final reading next week.

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Ordinance No. 19870

Accepting the sum of \$2,500 from the State of Washington Law & Justice Grant No. 1015 for deposit in Fund No. 586, authorizing the transfer of the sum of \$333 from the Nondepartmental account to Fund No. 586 and appropriating from Fund No. 586 the sum of \$2,833 for the purpose of providing specialized training for certain law enforcement personnel.

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Chief Lyle Smith explained to Council that this ordinance will provide for the execution of the contract and the accepting of the monies for establishing the fund.

The Ordinance was set over for final reading next week.

Ordinance No. 19871

Authorizing the execution of a grant award agreement with the U. S. Dept. of Economic Opportunity for Recreation Support Program for 1973 in the sum of \$53,000, appropriating from "Fund No. 583" the sum of \$53,000 for operation costs for the recreation support program and declaring an emergency making necessary the passage of this ordinance and its taking effect immediately upon publication.

Mel Jackson, Department of Human Development Director, explained to Council the program is gatting off to a late start due to problems with the Office of Economic Opportunity and the earliest the project could now start is July 16, 1973, which accounts for the emergency of the Ordinance.

The Ordinance was set over for final reading next week.

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RESOLUTIONS :

Resolution No. 22266

Authorizing the sale of approximately 80,000 lbs. of scrap metal, copper, wire, and pipe to Sternoff Metals Corporation and J. Simon & Sons, Inc.

Mr. Sonntag moved that the Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Mrs. Egan. Voice vote was taken and carried. The Resolution was declared adopted.

Resolution No. 22267

Authorizing the proper officer to execute an agreement with Bunge Service for the furnishing of certain petroleum products at certain agreed terms and prices and waiving the requirement for competitive bidding.

Dr. Herrmann moved that the Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Mrs. Egan. Voice vote was taken and carried. The Resolution was declared adopted.

Resolution No. 22268

Rejecting all bids for Work Order 91156 sanitary sewers in alleys west of Pacific Avenue from South 52nd to South 64th and alleys between South "D" and alley west of Pacific Avenue from South 52nd to South 61st as they exceed the Engineer's estimate.

Dr. Herrmann moved that the Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Mr. Nalley. Voice vote was taken and carried. The Resolution was declared adopted. City Council Minutes - Page 8 - July 3, 1973

Resolution No. 22269

Authorizing the execution of an agreement with the Boeing Aerospace Company to perform an analysis of the refuse collection system.

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Mr. Sonntag moved that the Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Mr. Moss.

John Bronow, Utilities Services Director, explained what they were doing regarding solid waste management planning and showed displays which clearly indicated the advantages of the Boeing analysis.

Voice vote was taken and carried. The Resolution was declared adopted.

Resolution No. 22270

Adopting the 1965-1975 Recreation and Open Space Plan Amendment as part of the Comprehensive Plan of the City of Tacoma.

Mrs. Egan moved that the Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Mr. Schroeder. Voice vote was taken and carried. The Resolution was declared adopted.

Resolution No. 22271

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Authorizing the execution of an agreement with Computer Systems, Inc. for additional computer time necessary to complete the Safetar II Project.

Mrs. Egan moved that the Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Mr. Sonntag. Voice vote was taken and carried. The Resolution was declared adopted.

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## COMMENTS BY MEMBERS OF THE CITY COUNCIL:

Mayor Johnston read a communication from Earl Mittelstaedt requesting the Council's concurrence in the appointment of Roger A. Howeiler as Executive Secretary of the Retirement Board and authorizing moving expenses from Wenatchee to Tacoma for Mr. Howeiler, not to axceed \$500.

Mayor Johnston moved to concur in the appointment of Roger A. Howeiler to the position of Executive Secretary of the Retirement Board, Step B, effective July 23, 1973, and that the Council further concur in the Board's authorization of reasonable actual moving costs from Wenatchee, not to exceed \$500. Seconded by Dr. Herrmann. Voice vote was taken and carried.

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Mayor Johnston called two special meetings of the Council, one on Thursday, July 12, 1973 at 7 p.m. and one on the following Thursday, July 19, 1973 at 7 p.m. to consider the Charter changes for the fall election ballot.

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Mr. Sonntag congratulated Mr. Harvey Singleton as coordinator, and Erling Mork and William Donaldson as the major guiding forces behind Mr. Singleton, on behalf of their presentation of the Urban Technology Field Days at the Public Utilities Building. He was very proud of the City of Tacoma which put us in a leadership position nationwide on how to modernize City government and streamline City operations.

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Mr. Schroeder submitted to Council his resignation as City Councilman, effective at the close of the meeting of July 3, 1973, because of ill health and the press of his personal business.

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Upon proper motion, the meeting adjourned at 9:40 p.m.
