EXPINISHED BUSINESS:

The L. I. D. Committee reports that hearing was held by the Committee on L <u>I D 2190 on March 15</u>, 1955 for grading and graveling of Columbia Avenue from Port-<u>land Avenue approximately 1000 feet east</u>, and at said meeting it was reported that a remonstrance of 83% had been filed against the improvement. In view of this large remonstrance, the **E** I D Committee sustained the remonstrance and ordered

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bat the district be abandoned and makes this recommendation to the Council. Moved by Fr. Stojack, seconded by Mr. Bratrud to concur in the recommendation of the L. I. D. committee and carried on roll call: Ayes 9: Nays 0; Absent 0.

City Manager Backstrom read in part from an opinion from the City Attorney on the liability of the City for defective watermains resulting in disease. This opinion stated that without question the City would be liable for damages on account of a lisease contracted by reason of the contamination of the City's water supply, however wrising, provided that the City had notice, either actual or constructive, that its water system was in a condition which might reasonably be expected to result in the collution of the water supply, causing such damage. Mr. Backstrom said that copies of this opinion would be forwarded to each member of the Council. The majority of the water expressed concern over the watermain L I Ds which have recently been voted down woroperty owners. Mrs. Goering said she felt a serious study should be made of these mases and a recommendation submitted to Council. It was pointed out by the Manager that where the present State Law the City is bound by the 60% remonstrances and does not have the right to override this. The Mayor requested the City Manager to cause a study to be ate of the areas where water mains have been turned down by remonstrance of property whers.

JEW BUSINESS:

Dr. Battin said he would like to publicly commend City Transit Bus Driver pric Proctor for careful driving. Today Mr. Proctor, driver of the bus on which he was a passenger, showed an interest in safety beyond his actual responsibility by vigorousby waving down a driver at North Tacoma Avenue near Stadium High School, thereby preventing an accident which might have been fatal. It was moved by Dr. Battin, seconded by Mr. Jensen, that a letter of commendation be sent by the City Clerk to Mr. Proctor.

While he had the floor, Dr. Battin said he would like to read a statement for the benefit of the Radio Friends of the "Committee of 100", as follows: "Under the changer-council form of government, the Council's only function is formulation of polley. The Council turns over the policy to the manager and his staff of experts to put into actual operation. The Committee's confusion arises from the assumption that the ouncil function is to manage, administer and direct the operations of the government. It this were actually the case then the present Council would be under paid and would not be giving sufficient time to the City's business. Much of the thunder of the "100" rests upon this failure to understand the function of the corporation form of business organization whereby the Board of Directors formulates policy and employs a manager and expert staff to carry out the policies. The analogy between a corporation and the City overnment is most apropos. The Citizens are the stockholders, the Council the Board of Directors, and the manager and his staff are the managers and staff as exist in a corporation. Thus we get a business like operation of a \$100,000,000 corporation."

Mayor Tollefson read a letter from E. F. Eldridge, Director and Chief angineer of State Pollution Control Commission, acknowledging the adoption by the Counil of Resolution No. 14213, as the first step toward preparation of a comprehensive anwerage plan for the City of Tacoma, and stating they will be happy to work with the ity's engineers in the preparation of a sewerage plan for Tacoma. Placed on file.

Mayor Tollefson advised the Council that he had turned the request of the achinist Non-Partisan Political League for a representative to appear at a public deate on City issues in the May 10th election, over to the "Citizens' Charter Committee", as he thought they merely wanted someone to debate, but that he has since heard the rganization was "insulted" when they learned he was not going to be the speaker. The ayor said he is willing to debate, providing the issues are made clear, but he wanted the thinking of the City Council on the policy to be followed, as there will undoubtedbe many similar requests in the near future, not only to him but to other members

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the Council as well. The matter was discussed and it was the opinion of most of members that it was not within the province of the City Council to take sides on issue or to endorse any person for freeholder, but that there was no reason any Council member could not accept any invitation to speak on the issue. Mrs. ring, Dr. Battin and Dr. Humiston all said they were willing to talk before interited groups.

Upon motion, duly seconded and carried, Council then adjourned at 8:45 P. M.
