Monday, March 7th, 1955.

Council met in regular session. Present 8, Battin, Bratrud, Goering, Hooker, Humiston, Perdue, Stojack, Tollefson. Absent 1, Jensen.

It was moved by Col. Hooker, seconded by Mrs. Goering, that the minutes of the previous meeting, copies of which had been mailed by the Clerk to each Councilman, be approved and the reading thereof be dispensed with. Motion carried: Ayes 7; Nays 1; Humiston (not voting); Absent 1; Jensen.

. MMUNICATIONS:

State of Washington Pollution Control Commission, advising they have under consideration L. I. Ds 1933, 1935 and 1936 for the expansion of the Tacoma Sewer System; that in accordance with the policy of the Pollution Control Commission not to approve xpansion of sewer systems without provision for adequate treatment, approval for these I Ds is being withheld; stating that there appears to be some uncertainty among City officials as to what will be accepted by the Commission as definite progress on the asis of which approvals for sewer construction may be issued, and that they feel it ighly desirable that a meeting be arranged between the members of the Tacoma City ouncil and their office to discuss this matter. Mr. Backstrom advised the Council that Mr. Eldridge, Chief Engineer for the Commission, had called at his office to liscuss the matter and had been informed that the City had contemplated building sewage lisposal plants at key points with the funds from a bond issue, but that this measure had been defeated at the election last November, which left the City without the necessary finances. Of the improvements mentioned in the letter, two have been completed and one involves the 6th and Pearl District, which will drain into the sewage disposal plant. Additional sewage disposal plants could be financed by bonds or by an increase in sewage rates to permit issuance of revenue bonds, he said. Mr. Backstrom felt it was desirable for the Council to meet with Mr. Eldridge and it was a question whether the Public Utilties Committee or the entire Council should participate in the meeting. After further iiscussion, the mayor requested Mr. Backstrom to arrange a meeting between the Public tility Committee and Mr. Eldridge.

Amending Sections 28 and 30 of Ordinance No. 14793, entitled: "An ordinance to regulate the location and use of buildings and the use of land within the City of Tacoma; to limit the height of buildings; to prescribe building areas and lines, and the size of yards and other open spaces and for these purposes to divide the

City into districts, etc." (Sec. 28- ZONING ORDINANCE- automobile space regulations, parking areas; Section 30- Nonconforming uses.) Read by title and placed in order of final reading.

Ordinance No. 15273.

Amending Section 8, 9 and 11 of Ordinance No. 13989 entitled: "An ordinance regulating the use and operation of the Tacoma Municipal Sewer System; providing for charges for handling sewage; declaring certain acts unlawful and declaring penalties therefor."

Read by title and placed in order of final reading.

Ordinance No. 15274.

Directing that, in certain voting precincts of the City, registration files shall be kept open in such precincts for the registration of voters, during the period commending on Monday, March 21, 1955, and continuing through Friday, March 25, 1955, between the hours of 9:00 A. M. and 9:30 P. M.; declaring an emergency and providing that this ord-inance shall take effect immediately after publication. Read by title and placed in order of final reading.

Vacating Horrison Street from Waterview to North Mason Avenue and the alley extending from Horrison Str. to North 44th Street and lying between Blocks 9 and 11, Mason's Waterfront Addition. Read by title. It was moved by Dr. Battin, seconded by Mr. Bratrud to suspend Rule 9, and carried unanimously on voice vote. The ordinance was then passed without having been read in full.

Authorizing the proper officers of the City of Tacoma to enter into an agreement between the City of Tacoma and the State of Washington, Department of Highways, for the construction of Federal Aid Project No. U-4601 (1), Milwaukee Way Extension; directing the transfer of Seventy-four Thousand Three Hundred Nineteen and 17/100 Dollars (\$74,319.17) from the City Street Fund to the City Street Investment Fund; and authorizing the expenditures of the same pursuant to the terms of the agreement. Read by title. It was moved by Col. Hooker to suspend Rule 9, seconded by Mr. Perdue and carried unanimously on voice vote. The Ordinance was then passed without having been read in full.

Authorizing and directing the City Attorney of the City of Tacoma to purchase certain property to be used for the widening and improving of South 19th Street; and providing for the payment thereof. Read by fitle. Hoved by Col. Hooker, Seconded by Dr. Battin to suspend Rule 9 and carried unanimously. Ordinance then passed without having been read toll call: Ayes 8; Nays 0; Absent 1; Jensen. erdinance No. 15262.

Amending Section 21 of Ordinance No. 14793, entitled: "An ordinance to regulate the location and use of land within the City of Tacoma; to limit the height of buildings; to prescribe building areas and lines, and the size of yards and other open spaces and for these purposes to divide the City into districts, etc. (ZONING ORDINANCE- including Self-service laundry in C-1 Commercial Districts and requiring they provide off-street barking spaces). Read by title. It was moved by Dr. Humiston, seconded by Mr. Stojack

to suspend Rule 9 and carried unanimously on voice vote. The ordinance was then passed without having been read in full.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

The Director of Public Utilities submitted assessment and assessment roll for the cost of the improvement in <u>Local Improvement District No. 5745</u>. It was moved by Dr. Humiston, seconded by Mr. Perdue that April 5, 1955 be fixed as the date for hearing on said assessment roll. Carried on roll call: Ayes 8; Nays 0; Absent 1; Jensen.

Mr. Backstrom called Council's attention to a request of the Light Department for reimbursement in amount of \$92,000 on account of changing its lines by reason of the construction of the Port Industrial Waterway Bridge, which the department claims the General Fund owes them as a result of a verbal agreement with the former City Council. He read from an opinion of City Attorney Boyle, dated September 29, 1954, which stated that a personal interview with four out of five former City Commissioners indicated that there was an oral agreement that the Light Division would be reimbursed to the extent of any balance remaining from the City's contribution of \$250,000. There was something like \$92,000 balance in the fund on completion of the Bridge, Mr. Backstrom said, which it would appear from Mr. Boyle's opinion was a legal obligation the General Fund was committed to pay. However there were no funds budgeted in 1955 for this purpose. so in order to meet the claim, money would have to be borrowed from the L.I.D. Guaranty Fund, he said. He recommended that the Light Division be contacted to ascertain whether or not this could be handled by payments over a four or five year basis, and asked for instructions from Council. The Council instructed Hr. Backstrom to negotiate with Light Department officials to see if the obligation can be paid over a four or five year period.

Mr. Backstrom advised the Council that he is in receipt of a request from the Metropolitan Park Board for \$12,236 for the grading and drainage of the parking area at the new Titlow Beach Swimming Pool, which they anticipate opening about June 5, 1955. He would like to have instructions from Council as to whether an emergency ordinance should be presented for Council action, since there are no funds in the Park Board Budget for this purpose. The matter was discussed and Dr. Humiston asked if any more requests of this nature would likely be made by the Park Board in 1955, and no answere to this question was forthcoming. He also said he would like to know if the Park Board had any unexpended Capital Outlay Funds. Mrs. Goering said she would like to know if the Park Board has any money put aside in bonds. At the conclusion of the discussion, Council instructed Mr. Backstrom to present an emergency ordinance for \$12,236.00 for drainage and grading Titlow Beach Parking area with Bratrud as sponsor.

Upon motion, duly seconded and carried, Council then adjourned at 9:00 P. M.
