City Council Chambers February 18, 1975 60

The meeting was called to order at 5:35 p.m.

FIRST READING OF ORDINANCES:

Amending Chapter 13.06 of the Official Code to add the Ordinance No. 20344 N.W. corner of So. 54th and Ferry Streets from an "R-2" to an "R-3" District. (Conifer Developments, Inc.)

Russ Buehler, Planning Department Director, reviewed the rezone request. He advised that the Planning Commission held a hearing on January 20, 1975 and approved the rezone with certain conditions. Under Ordinance 20266, effective January 1, 1975, Council no longer holds hearings on rezone requests. After the Planning Commission (Hearings Examiner) approval, the ordinance comes to the City Council for first reading. The Council must base its decision on the hearing held by the Planning Commission. Final reading of the ordinance will occur when all

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conditions, restrictions, or modifications have been accomplished.

Council made no modifications. Final reading of the Ordinance will be scheduled when all conditions of the Planning Commission have been met.

Ordinance No. 20345 West corner of So. 38th St. and Sheridan Ave. from an "R-2" and "R-3" to an "R-4-LT" District. (Irvin H. Miller)

Mr. Buehler reviewed the rezone request for Council. Council made no modification. Final reading of the Ordinance will be scheduled when all conditions of the Planning Commission have been met.

Ordinance <u>No. 20346</u> Naming an unnamed extension of Portland Avenue northerly from Bay Street and changing the name of Canal Street to Portland Avenue.

Ron Button, City Engineer, explained to Council the reasons for the naming of these streets as Portland Avenue.

The Ordinance was set over for final reading next week.

Ordinance <u>No. 20347</u> Appropriating \$37,500.00 or so much thereof as may be necessary from the Federal Shared Revenue Fund for the purpose of establishing and operating the Homemaker Home Health Aide Program to be administered by the Health Department.

Herb Kuzniczci, Budget/Personnel Supervisor of the Heatlh Department, reviewed the program and answered questions of Council members.

The Ordinance was set over for final reading next week.

Ordinance No. 20348 Appropriating \$20,107.00 or so much thereof as may be necessary from the Federal Shared Revenue Fund for the purpose of establishing and operating the Eastside Health Clinic to be administered by the Health Department.

Mr. Kuzniczci reviewed the program and answered questions of Council.

The Ordinance was set over for final reading next week.

Ordinance No. 20349 Appropriating \$40,000.00, or so much thereof as may be necessary from the Federal Shared Revenue Fund for the purpose of establishing and operating Mary Bridge Pre-Natal and Infant Nutrition Program to be administered by the Health Department.

Mr. Kuzniczci reviewed the program and answered questions of Council.

The Ordinance was set over for final reading next week.

Ordinance <u>No. 20350</u> Appropriating \$20,499.00, or so much thereof as may be necessary from the Federal Shared Revenue Fund for the purpose of establishing and operating a Poison INformation Center to be administered by the Health Department.

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Mr. Kuzniczci reviewed the program and answered questions of Council.

The Ordinance was set over for final reading next week.

Ordinance <u>No. 20351</u> Amending Chapter 6.62 of the Official Code relative to admissions tax on Bowling, Ice and Roller Skating.

Mrs. Egan moved that the ordinance be removed from the Ayenda. Seconded by Mr. Hudson. Voice vote was taken and carried.

The Ordinance was removed from the agenda.

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RESOLUTIONS:

Resolution No. 23210

(Continued from the meeting of February 4th) Authorizing execution of a contract with PRC Public Management Services, Inc. for design and installation of a computer assisted Dispatch System for the sum of \$166,848.00.

Mayor Johnston moved that the Resolution be removed from the Agenda and that the administration reestablish negotiations between the two bidders and return to the City Council within 30 days with the results of that process. Seconded by Dr. Herrmann. Roll call was taken resulting in 7 ayes: Egan, Herrmann, Hudson, Moss, Nelson, Sonntag, and Mayor Johnston. Nays: 2 - Nalley and Warnick.

Caroline Gallacci, member of the Landmarks Preservation Commission, urged adoption of the Resolution.

Dr. Herrmann moved that the Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Mrs. Egan. Voice vote was taken and carried. The Resolution was declared adopted.

Resolution <u>No. 23228</u> Approving Tacoma-Pierce County Board of Health Resolution 74 establishing the position of Vector Control Specialist and setting the rate of pay.

Odd A. Lund, Personnel Director, asked that an amendment be made to correct the rate of pay from range 33.6 to 36.0 to correspond with the same classification as the position covered under Resolution 23233.

Mr. Sonntag moved that the amendment he made as requested. Seconded by Mr. Moss. Voice vote was taken and carried.

Voice vote was taken and carried on the amended Resolution. The Resolution as amended was declared adopted.

Establishing additional temporary positions in the Public Service Employment Program and the Emergency Employment Program.

Mr. Nalley moved that the Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Mr. Warnick. Voice vote was taken and carried. The Resolution was declared adopted.

Resolution <u>No. 23230</u> Authorizing execution of a collective bargaining agr eement with the Joint Labor Committee to be effective January 1, 1975 through December 31, 1976.

Mr. Sonntag moved that the Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Mr. Warnick. Voice vote was taken and carried. The Resolution was declared adopted.

Resolution <u>No. 23231</u> Authorizing the proper officers of the City to execute and submit a project prospectus for Orchard Street from Fircrest City limits to South 56th Street under the Federal Aid Urban Program (FAM).

Mr. Warnick mov ed that the Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Mr. Nalley. Voice vote was taken and carried. The Resolution was declared adopted.

Resolution <u>No. 23232</u> Authorizing the proper officers of the City to execute and submit a project prospectus for improving certain arterial street intersections in the Central Business District under the Federal Aid Urban Program (FAM).

Mr. Moss moved that the Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Mr. Sonntag. Voice vote was taken and carried. The Resolution was declared adopted.

Resolution <u>No. 23233</u> Approving Tacoma-Pierce County Board of Health Resolution No. 76 relative to pay and compensation.

Dr. Herrmann moved that the Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Mr. Sonntag. Voice vote was taken and carried. The Resolution was declared adopted.

Resolution <u>No. 23234</u> Authorizing the purchase of one paging terminal for the Police Communications Center from BBL Industries, Inc., Atlanta, GA for the sum of \$6,037.50.

Mr. Sonntag moved that the Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Mrs. Egan. Voice vote was taken and carried. The Resolution was declared adopted.

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COMMENTS BY MEMBERS OF THE CITY COUNCIL:

Mayor Johnston read a letter received from the President of Tacoma Community College regarding pending State legislation which would increase community college tuition approximately 33 percent and urging that the City Council take a stand against this legislation. Mayor Johnston moved that the Tacoma City Council has taken a position against the tuition increase proposal. Seconded by Mr. Sonntag. Voice vote was taken and carried.

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Mr. Sonntag suggested that Senator Stortini, Chairman of the Senate Education Committee, be notified of the Council's motion on the tuition legislation.

Mr. Sonntag thanked all members of the City Council for the unanimous vote in passing the Summer Youth Employment Program.
