UNFINISHED BUSINESS

This being the time set for hearing of remonstrances against improvement proposed in Local Improvement District 4022, paving, sidewalks and viaduct on Cliff Ave. from South 2nd to Division and E Street, the City Clerk reported the due publication of Resolution 7044 and the filing in her office by the Commissioner of Public Works of all plans and estimates required by said resolution and a statement from the Commissioner of Finance showing no delinquent assessments against property in the district. A number of verbal

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:

That having granted the petition of Mrs. C. E. Harris, et al.

That it is the intention of said Council to order the local improvement hereinafter set forth, and to levy and collect special assessments to pay the cost and expense of such improvement, upon the real property which is hereinafter described, to the extent that such property shall be benefited thereby.

That said improvement shall consist of laying a sanitary sewer of eight inch (8") pipe, together with the necessary wyes, risers and manholes, in the alley between Park Avenue and Yakima Avenue from South 56th Street to the manhole at the north line of Houtz Addition to the City of Tacoma, Wash.

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That the real property to be benefited by said improvement and which will constitute Local Improvement District No. 1164 is described as follows, to-wit:-

All of the lots in Blocks 1 and 2, Eusterday's South Side Addition to Tacoma, Washington.

Platted tracts of land described as follows:

Beginning at the southeast corner of Block 1, Eusterday's South Side Addition to Tacoma, Washington; thence south to the northeast corner of Houtz Addition to the City of Tacoma, Wash.; thence West 120 feet; thence North to the South line of Eusterday's South Side Addition to Tacoma, Washington; thence East 120 feet to the point of beginning.

Beginning at the southwest corner of Block 2, Eusterday's South Side Addition to Tacoma, Washington; thence south to the North line of Houtz Addition to the City of Tacoma, Washington; thence East 120 feet; thence North to the South line of said Eusterday's South Side Addition; thence West 120 feet to the point of beginning.

Beginning at the Northwest corner of Lot 3, Block 2, Eusterday's South Side Addition to Tacoma, Washington; thence North 50 feet; thence East 120 feet; thence South 50 feet; thence West 120 feet to the point of beginning.

The assessments levied against said lots and property to become due and payable at the option of the property owners in five (5) equal, annual installments, with interest at the rate of six (6) per cent. per annum on deferred payments.

That the work of said improvement be done and said special assessments be levied and collected in the manner provided by Chapter 28 of the Acts of the Legislature of the State of Washington of 1911, and Ordinance No. 4611 of said City.

That all persons who may desire to object to the making of said improvement in the manner above set forth shall do so in writing and file said remonstrance with the City Clerk at or prior to 9:30 A.M. on the date set for hearing before this Council to be held at the Council Chamber in the City Hall on Monday, the 31st day of January, 1921, at 10 o'clock A.M.

That the Commissioner of Public Works submit to this Council at a date prior to the 31st day of January, 1921, the estimated cost of said improvement; a statement of the proportionate amount thereof which should be borne by the property within the proposed assessment district; a statement of the aggregate assessed value of the real estate, exclusive of improvements, within said district according to the valuation last placed upon it for the purpose of general taxation; together with a diagram or print showing thereon the lots, tracts and parcels of land and other property which will be specially benefited by said improvement and the estimated amount of the cost and expense of the improvement to be borne by each lot, tract or parcel of land or other property; and

That the City Clerk publish this resolution in two consecutive issues of the official newspaper as required by law.

## NEW BUSINESS

A committee representing the Foremen & Superintendent's Club of the Todd Yards brought before the Council the dangerous condition of the roadway between the 11th Street Bridge and the Todd Yards. Co. would bare one-half the expense, which they refused to do. The Mayor suggested that the names of the truck drivers responsible for the wood be handed to the Commissioner of Public Safety for the purpose of arrest. The Committee agreed to act upon this suggestion.

A representative of the South End Improvement Club complained about the sewerage condition at South 33th and G Streets because of sewerage backing up into basements and also running into the open in this section. Commissioner Harrison stated that information relative to the trunk sewer would be submitted to the Council for action within 60 or 90 days.

The purpose of this conference was to arrive at ways and means of financing the construction of the line. Mr. Sullivan urged the financial inability of the T.R. & P. Co. to make this extension and to bear the losses incident to its operation. The Mayor suggested that civic-minded citizens might be induced to purchase the bonds for the approximate cost of \$33,000., provided this could be kept as a separate venture. Mr. Sullivan requested that the matter be taken under advisement until Thursday at 10 o'clock, when he hoped to have some definite proposition to offer. The request was granted and hearing continued to Thursday, May 26th.

NEW BUSINESS

Due to the legal complications arising, connected with the riparian rights of the Lake Cushman Power Site, it was suggested by the City Attorney that legal assistance be secured for expert briefing. Upon motion of Commissioner Harrison, an ordinance appropriating not to exceed \$500 was ordered to be introduced. It was the general understanding that Attorney Dix Rowland be employed to perform this service. (Action taken May 19th and confirmed in legislative session on this date.)

As Mr. Novak presented the consent of the property owners within a radius of 300 feet to the establishment of his business at this address, the petition was referred back to the Commissioner of Public Safety for reconsideration.

Committee of the Whole, reporting on meeting of June 8, 1921 and recommending that communication of Commissioner of Public Works, relative to work requested to be done on Lincoln Park tract owned by John S. Baker interests, be referred back to the Commissioner and investigation made as to proportionate share of the Oregon-Washington Ry. Co. in the cost of this work. WHEREAS, the Tacoma Railway and Power Company is financially unable to lay a double track line through said improvement and lay a permanent paving at this time; and

WHEREAS, for the benefit of said district and persons living therein along the route of the proposed improvement, and to assure double tracking at the earliest possible time, it is deemed advisable that the City proceed with the laying of the permanent paving on either side of the street railway tracks, leaving space between said paving sufficient for the laying of double tracks by the Tacoma Railway and Power Company, and permit the said Company to lay planking for the full width between the City's permanent paving and to properly maintain the same; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF TACOMA:

That the Tacoma Railway and Power Company is hereby granted the right to rebuild, repair and/or relocate its single track, together with sidings and turnouts, as it now exists

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in and along McKinley Avenue between the said north line of Wright Avenue southerly to the center line of East 40th Street, and to lay planking and maintain the same satisfactory to the City for the entire space between the permanent paving laid or to be laid by the City along and on either side of said track;

That the said Tacoma Railway and Power Company shall not be compelled to comply at this time with the provisions of its franchise Ordinance No. 1322 to pave its tracks through said improvement with the same or equally as good material as the City;

That the Tacoma Railway and Power Company shall as soon as it is financially able to do so, lay a double track line the full length of said improvement and pave the same in accordance with the terms of the said franchise Ordinance No. 1322;

That the laying of plank as permitted under this resolution shall in no way effect, impair or invalidate any of said Tacoma Railway and Power Company's rights under its franchise Ordinance No. 1322, or any of its rights or privileges under any other franchise ordinance of the City of Tacoma now held by it.

McSherry, being sworn by the City Clerk, duly and regularly testified that on the 28th day of July, at 9:25 P.M. he bought at the soft drink place of E. P. Christian intoxicating liquor, which was sold him by one Bishop, whose name appears in the police records also as E. Smith, and that on the 29th day of July he bought at the bar at the same place red moonshine, at which time said Christian drank with him; that money <sup>paid</sup> for the liquor was placed in the till belonging to Christian. Commissioner Shoemaker asked the witness if he had been approached at any time relative to the case, and he replied that the attorney for the defendant had requested him to refrain from stating that Christian drank with him on the date above mentioned. The clerk of the police court was duly called, and the records showed that the said Bishop was convicted on August 31, 1921 of the crime of illegal sale of intoxicating liquors.

Thereupon, in view of the evidence presented, F. A. Shoemaker, Commissioner of Public Safety moved that the license of the said E. P. Christian to sell soft drinks at 1207 Pacific Avenue, Tacoma Washington, be revoked. The motion was seconded by H. Roy Harrison, and a roll call taken, all five commissioners voting for revocation of the license. It was then ORDERED that said license be revoked.

WHEREAS, more than two weeks prior to the first Monday in September A.D., 1921, the several offices of the City of Tacoma filed with the Chief Auditing officer of said City of Tacoma, to-wit: the City Controller, an itemized estimate of all the expenditures required by their respective departments for the ensuing year; and

WHEREAS, in addition to the estimated amount required for the maintenance of his department for the ensuing year, the Chief Auditing officer of said City of Tacoma also prepared an estimate of the revenues of said City other than taxes that are likely to accrue to said City of Tacoma the various amounts required to meet interest and redemption payments, the necessity for sinking funds and the net amount of the surplus deficit as established at the close of the previous fiscal year; and

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Commissioner Shoemaker reported that he had received a communication from J. M. Bell of the Pacific Messenger Co., requesting a weeks delay in the passage of the ordinance granting franchise to the American District Telegraph Co., by which time he will have information which he is gathering relative thereto to present to the Council. Action was therefore deferred until October 15th.

The Commissioner of Public Works reported back on the remonstrance of the Hotel Company of Tacoma, et al, 10-5-21, protesting against assessment in L.I.D. 4083, recommending that protest be overruled and assessment roll confirmed. Recommendation concurred in and assessment and assessment roll confirmed and City Attorney instructed to draft the ordinance.

This being the day set for the hearing of the charges preferred against Frank Magrini for the revocation of his license to sell soft drinks, said license being numbered S.D. 60 and the place designated on said license being 1315 Pacific Avenue; the said Frank Magrini having been duly and regularly notified in accordance with the ordinance, as appeared by the affidavit of John B. Majerus on file with the City Clerk; and being represented by his attorney, S. A. Gagliardi, on the date set for the hearing, to-wit: Thursday, the 6th day of October, 1921, at the hour of ten o'clock a.m.; Attorney Gagliardi moved that Mr. Shoemaker be barred from sitting as one of the judges, inasmuch as the charges were preferred by him against the defendant. Upon vote of the Council the motion was overruled. James G. Graves, special police officer, being sworn by C. M. Riddell, Notary Public, duly and regularly testified that on July 27, 1921, he, with others, bought approximately ten drinks of whiskey from one Frank Bonagida; that said Bonagida was bar tender for Frank Magrini, who is owner of a soft drink parlor at 1315 Pacific Avenue; that other persons were buying and drinking intoxicating liquor at the same time. On cross examination he stated this liquor was bought at approximately two o'clock P.M.; that this was the first place he visited that day. Mr. Chapman, constable of the Police Court, being sworn by C. M. Riddell, Notary Public, produced the records of the Police Court, which showed that Frank Bonagida was arrested, and convicted on September 2nd for the sale of intoxicating liquor. John B. Majerus was next called, and being sworn, testified that when he served the notices as set forth in the affidavit on file with the City Clerk, one Bonagida was acting as bar tender at 1315 Pacific Avenue; that he saw Magrini but once, Bonagida receiving the copies of the second and third notices of hearing on charges preferred by the Commissioner of Public Safety; that at the time of the serving of the third notice the witness asked Bonagida if he was the same person who was arrested and convicted for selling intoxicating liquor on September 2, 1921, and he answered "Yes". The witness further stated that there was unquestionable evidence of a general sale of intoxicating liquor, as he saw men staggering, Bonagida himself being somewhat under the influence of liquor. No witnesses were introduced by the defense. Further cross examination was waived by the attorney for the defendant.

Thereupon, in view of the evidence presented, F. Shoemaker, Commissioner of Public Safety, moved that the license of the said Frank Magrini to sell soft drinks at 1315 Pacific Avenue, Tacoma, Washington, be revoked. The motion was seconded by H. Roy Harrison, and a roll call taken, all five commissioners voting for revocation of the license. It was accordingly ORDERED that said license be revoked.

NEW BUSINESS

The question of a half-holiday to grant the employees of the City an opportunity to attend the Puyallup fair on the afternoon of Tacoma Day was brought up by Commissioner Davison, this having been the custom in the City Hall for a number of years. It was moved by Harrison, and seconded by Davison, that the holiday be granted, with the provision that the finance and light and water windows be kept open for the convenience of the public. Motion carried.

A complaint was made relative to the zoning ordinance, said the statement being made that this ordinance should require the permission of the residents as well as the



property owners living within a radius of 300 feet, in order that a business house may be opened in any residential section.

## UNFINISHED BUSINESS

It was acknowledged by those present that the condition is no worse than it had been for many years, although it continues to be a vice-ridden district. It was suggested by Commissioner Shoemaker that the committee and the Police Department co-operate to remedy the condition.

Commissioner Davison informed the Council that he plans to force the Park Board to reduce the number of services in Wright Park and meter all the water used. The Council approved the plan.

Friday, November 11th, Armistice Day, was, by unanimous vote, made a general holiday in the City Hall, with all departments closed.

Initial Resolution 7133 - L I D 1267

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:

That having granted the petition of C. W. O'Flyng, et al,

That it is the intention of said Council to order the local improvement hereinafter set forth, and to levy and collect special assessments to pay the cost and expense of such improvement, upon the real property which is hereinafter described, to the extent that such property shall be benefited thereby.

That said improvement shall consist of grading to the established grade North 16th Street from Junett Street to Cedar Street with a roadway thirty (30) feet in width, with a parking space on each side thereof twenty-five (25) feet in width, and Pine Street from the south line of North 16th Street to the north line of North 17th Street in Buckley's Addition, with a roadway twenty (20) feet in width, with a parking space on each side thereof eight and one-half (8½) feet in width.

## REPORTS OF OFFICERS

3360 The Commissioner of Light and Water reported back on the petition of South Tacoma Business Men's Assn., 12-5-21, for improvements in lighting system on Union Avenue with recommendations as follows, which were concurred in by the Council: (1) That present ornamental lighting along Union Avenue be increased to 200 watt lamps; (2) that all bracket lamps on 24th Street from Union Avenue to Pine be replaced with 250 watt lamps; (3) that bracket lamps of 250 watts be installed on 45th and Union, the SW corner of 20th and Union and SE corner of 50th and Adams; (4) that lights at 51st and 52nd on Washington be increased to 250 watt lamps; (5) that bracket lamp be installed on corner of 68th and Union; (6) that present lamp at 66th and Railroad and 68th and swamp west of N.P. track be replaced with 250 watt lamp; (7) that bracket lamps on east side of Union from 43rd to 50th be denied for reason that telephone poles carry the telephone company's toll lines and the company does not permit City wires to be installed on poles carrying toll lines, but recommending that bracket lights be installed on each city pole on east side of Union Avenue between 43rd and 50th instead of every other pole, and that 250 watt lamps be installed; for permanent lighting of Union Avenue, that L I D lighting on Union Avenue be extended north to 43rd Street and south from 50th Street to city limits; that request for installation of bracket lamps in alley between Union and Washington on 50th and 52nd be denied for reason that heretofore the City has not installed lights on alley only in local improvement districts. Also reported that a survey of residence lighting in South Tacoma is being made with the view of improving as much as possible the present system. (Action on this petition was taken in administrative session December 22nd and confirmed on this date.)



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2237 The Commissioner of Public Works reported back on the petition of Chas. P. Iott, 12-12-21, requesting that buildings and fences be removed from alley between Sawyer and Ainsworth from 33d to 34th Street, stating that in order to comply with above request it would be necessary to order a survey to establish alley lines, and until such time as alley is graded and line set, the department of Public Works should not interfere. Report adopted.

2238 Also reported on deed of Kirby P. Hickey, 12-12-21, for alley through east half of Block 147, Second School Land Addition, stating that there are no taxes or assessments against the property and recommending that deed be accepted and recorded. Deed accepted, to be handed to City Controller for recording and filing.
