Hayor Tollefson explained that the purpose of the recessed meeting this sing was to discuss the proposed Bond Program for the coming November Ballot and Report on the Review of the Classification Plan and Recommended Compensation for the City of Tacoma, Washington, as submitted by G. M. Morris, Acting Field rvisor of the Public Administration Service.

Mayor Tollefson asked that Mr. Backstrom present the Administration's posed Bond Program, which is outlined in CM-#46, dated July 19, 1954. Mr. Back-"or stated that the Bond proposition must be filed with the County Auditor on before September 16th in order for it to appear on the November ballot, and that rlinance must be passed by the Council on or before August 30th, in order for necessary work to be completed by the September 16th deadline. He explained 282 in the Street lighting program the figure of \$1,485,875.00 presented by the Planning Cormission had been rounded out to \$1,500,000 and that he was submittan additional list of six streets to be improved if money is available from savings ther street lighting projects. Under Section II of the report, it is recommended the Administration to include the South 38th Street Trunk, Arlington Trunk, T. & . Sulch Reconstruction and the Titlow Beach Treatment Plant and necessary Interceptors, "aling \$2,100,000; Section III includes the following Street Projects: South 19th reat to be improved only from I or J to Union Avenue; South 56th Street between erner and Ferry; on South 12th Street to South 11th Street near Sprague; South 38th are t from G Street to A Street; and replacing the existing bridge on East 34th areat between R and T Street; total cost of the Street Projects to be \$960,000.00, stated. Mr. Backstrom said that Sec. IV, the Public Works Garage should be rerequirements, the design of the building will not serve the purposes and construcm is such that a serious fire hazard is created. The location of the present willing is poor because of downtown traffic congestion and this site ties up a portion fine potential commercial property which could pay substantial taxes as a new City ± 1 ling could be constructed on City-owned property in the Nalley valley area. Mr. . A. Jordan, Chairman of the City Planning Commission, presented their views and commendations for the Bond Program, which substantially corresponded to Mr. Backtrom's report. After a brief question and discussion period on the different proposals, it was moved by Dr. Battin, seconded by Col. Hooker that the Bond Program as whitted by the Planning Commission and as modified and added to by the Administraten be reduced to Ordinance form, and that the City Manager be directed to prepare uch ordinance as in his opinion would be both expedient and legal. Tomsho of the Staff of the Public Administration Service is present to explain in detail the Report on the Review of the Classification Plan is Recommended Compensation Plan for the City of Tacoma, as prepared by the Public lainistration Service.
