Selecting Lybrand, Ross Bros. & Montgomery, a recognized firm of certified public accountants, as the firm to provide for the City a running audit of all accounts books of the City and a comprehensive annual report on the financial condition of the City, as required by Section7.14 of the City Charter, and instructing the City attorney to submit to the City Council an ordinance providing for the employment of Mayor Tollefson read for Council's information a definition "continuous audit" as defined on page 229 of "Municipal Accounting and Auditing", ich deals with governmental accounting. Dr. Battin, a member of the Audit Committee, sphasized that the audit was authorized by the Freeholders to furnish a check on the perations of the City Manager, Director of Utilities and the City as a whole, and stated that it is not merely a technical job of auditing, but is a check on the current perations of the City for the City Council's information. Certain members of the Counil expressed the opinion that a great deal of consideration should be given to the brawing of the ordinance and the contract by the City Attorney, and that possibly representative of the firm of accountants should confer with the City Attorney relative to certain phases of the contract. Hr. Bratrud and Col. Hooker both favored iving the local firm of Robert T. Knight the privilege of making the audit, and if their work does not prove satisfactory after a certain trial period, it could then e given to the national firm. Mayor Tollefson told the Council that the National

had been chosen because they had a great deal of experience in municipal accounting, (whereas the Robert T. Enight Co. has had no experience in this type of accounting) ter a discussion period by the Council, Mayor Tollefson concluded by commending the wiit Committee for the outstanding work they had done in sifting information, interiewing applicants and compiling the excellent report they submitted to the Council embers. This represented a good deal of extra time on the part of the Committee, and they should be given a vote of thanks, the Mayor added.
