### FIRST READING OF ORDINANCES:

## Ordinance No. 14984.

Amending Section 58 of Ordinance No. 11701, entitled: "An ordinance regulating travel and traffic on the streets of the City of Tacoma; providing a penalty for the violation thereof; repealing Ordinances Nos. 10598, 11054, 11385 and 11617, and

all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith; and declaring that his ordinance shall take effect immediately after publication." and repealing Ordinance to. 14448. (One Way Streets- add Cliff Avenue from East 10th to East 11th, southbound only and 11th Street off-ramp from East 10th Street and Cliff Avenue to East 11th Street Bridge, northbound only). Read by title and placed in order of final reading.

## ordinance No. 14985.

Amending Ordinance No. 14793 entitled :"An ordinance to regulate the location and use of buildings and the use of land within the City of Tacoma; to limit the height of building; to prescribe building area and line, and the size of yards and other open spaces and for these purposes to divide the City into districts; and repealing Ordinances Nos. 12703, 9889 and 9598 and all amendments thereto." by adding thereto a new Section to be known as Section 9B. (including in Class C-2 Commercial District the southerly frontage of South 38th Street between the easterly R/W line of South Pine Street and the westerly R/W line of the Sprague Avenue Freeway and the Southerly R/W line of South 38th Street and the Northerly R/W line of South 39th Street). Read by title and placed in order of final reading.

## riinance No. 14986.

Amending Section 23 of Ordinance No. 14887 entitled: "An ordinance to be known as the Administrative Code providing for the establishment of a complete plan of administrative organization of the government of the City of Tacoma; defining the jurisdiction, functions and powers of departments, offices, boards and other units of the City; and establishing administrative procedures; and repealing Ordinance No. 14822." (Amending portion relative to Finance Department). Read by title and placed in order of Final reading.

City Manager Backstrom advised the Council that the new Water Rate Ordinance (#14980) which was passed by the City Council on March 1st would automatically increase the sewer tax approximately 7%. He stated that in his opinion the sewer tax should memain at its present level, and the rates should not be increased until a thorough check can be made of the department's operations, and for this reason he has asked the City Attorney to prepare an Ordinance to take care of this situation.

As this ordinance was not on the Council Agenda, it was moved by Dr. Humiston to Suspend Rule 7 (regarding the filing of new matter to be considered by the Council) in order to consider it at this time. Motion seconded by Dr. Battin and carried unanimously on voice vote.

## FINAL READING OF ORDINANCES:

# Ordinance No. 14987.

Amending Section 8 of Ordinance No. 13989 entitled: "An ordinance regulating the use and operation of the Tacoma Municipal Sewer System; providing for charges for handling sewage; declaring certain acts unlawful and declaring penalties therefor." repealing Section 1 of Ordinance No. 14015; and declaring a public emergency requiring the immediate passage of this ordinance and the taking effect thereof immediately after publication. Read by title. It was moved by Dr. Humiston, seconded by Dr. Battin to suspend rule 9 of the Council rules, and carried unanimously on voice vote. Roll was then called on the passage of the ordinance, resulting as follows:

#### NEW BUSINESS:

Dr. Battin pointed out that Sec. 2.6 of the City Chaster provides that if

a member is absent from 3 or more Council meetings without being excused by the Council, he shall be deemed to have forfeited his office. Since Mr. Perdue now comes under this category, it was moved by Dr. Battin that Councilman Perdue be excused from Council meetings for the duration of his illness. Motion seconded by Dr. Humiston and carried on roll call: Ayes 8; Nays 0; Absent 1; Perdue.

The Clerk read a letter from Mrs. R. T. Morgan, President of the Fawcett P. T. A., submitting a petition bearing 55 signatures, which requested the Council to pass an ordinance prohibiting dogs on school play-grounds unless they are on a leash, which was circulated at their last meeting; and stating a motion was passed supporting this legislation. Placed on file.

The Clerk also read a letter from Elmer D. Stirn, stating he is in favor of the stringent milk law passed by Council on July lat, but that he does not favor the fluoridation of City Water until more information is obtained. Placed on file.

Mayor Tollefson read a letter from Frank H. Backstrom, relative to appointment of two committee representatives from the City Council, one to serve on the Planning Committee" and one on the "Legislative Committee" which were formed at the Government Clearing House Meeting on March 4th at the Vocation School. Mayor Tollefson asked for volunteers to serve on these committees and Dr. Battin offered to serve on the Legislative Committee and Mrs. Goering on the Planning Committee.

Upon motion, duly seconded and carried, Council then adjourned at 8:20 P.M.
