FINAL READING OF ORDINANCES:

Providing for the establishment of regular hours for the office of the Mayor at the City Hall, establishing and increasing the salary of said Mayor; and providing for the personnel to operate said office. Read by title.

Dr. Humiston stated that he was not in favor of this ordinance, and would vote against it, as, in his opinion, it is in distinct opposition to the State Constitution, and referred to Section 13, Article 2, which reads as follows: "Limitation on members holding office in the State - No member of the legislature, during the term for which he is elected, shall be appointed or elected to any civil office in the state, which shall have been created, or the emoluments of which shall have been increased, during the term for which he was elected."

Marshall McCormick, City Attorney reported that the amendment attached to the Councilmen's copy of the ordinance was drawn at their request, and for their information.

Dr. Battin suggested that there should be two separate ordinances, one creating the position of a secretary to the Mayor and Council, and two, providing for the increase in the Mayor's salary, and he expressed his opinion that he would be in favor of having a secretary to the Mayor and Council, but would not be in favor of increasing the Mayor's salary at this time.

Mrs. Goering stated that she feels \$6,000 total salary for the Mayor is far too great, and that \$3,600 total would be a sufficient salary. She also stated that all members of the Council put in time far in excess of that for which they are compensated.

Everett Jensen spoke in favor of the \$6,000 salary for the Mayor, stating

at the Mayor should be paid enough to allow him to devote more time to his duties as

Mr. Bratrud also spoke in favor of the ordinance, stating that he would vote

n favor of the ordinance as presented.

Col. Hooker stated that the Council has had a good example of the duties of the lavor, as exemplified by the number of invitations received from the various organizations in civic bodies. He stated further that he would favor a substantial increase in the lawor's salary but, he feels the Council members should also participate in the activities.

Mr. Gerrit VanderEnde, member of the Utility Board and of the 1953 Freeholders muittee stated that in his opinion the Ordinance is ill-advised and impractical, and that should be killed. He stated further it was only two months ago that the people voted retain this Charter, and "you are chipping away at the very foundation of the City-anager form of government, and if a price tag were put on the post, the Mayor would be say trying to earn the salary, the salary would be raised again and pretty soon you would establish two different heads of government". He also stated that if the Mayor's halary were increased, it should be done by a vote of the people, and added that the Mayor paid as a Mayor, and not for his services.

Dr. Hugh J. Tudor, professor at the College of Puget Sound, and also a member the 1953 Freeholders Committee gave a comparison of the salaries paid to the Mayors of cities under the Council-Manager form of government. \$7,500 was the highest salary aid to a Mayor, with the average being \$3,594. He also stated that a thorough study should

e made before any action is taken.

Hayor Tollefson stated that he was very surprised at the sudden change of Council'sopinion. He then outlined the Hayors work for a typical week, and said that he spends approximately 50 hours a week at this job.

Col. Hooker then added that he was wavering a bit on his decision, but that would not do anything to go against the Charter, and therefore would vote against the

rdinance, after hearing the comments made by Mr. VarderEnde and Dr. Tudor.

Dr. Humiston stated that he would moved to amend the Ordinance as submitted the City Attorney, which was requested at last weeks Council Meeting. Motion seconded by Mr. Bratrud. Motion lost on roll call: Ayes 3; Bratrud, Jensen, Tollefson; Nays 6; Battin, Goering, Hooker, Humiston, Perdue, Stojack; Absent 0. Roll was then called on the original Ordinance, resulting as follows:

From the President's Committee for Traffic Safety to attend and participate in its Western Regional Conference to be held at the Sheraton-Palace Hotel in San Francisco California on May 31st and June 1st, 1956. He also advised that he had been requested to give a speech on the subject, "Appraisal of Traffic Safety Needs - Services and Assistance Available" at the meeting for cities from 100,000 to 200,000 population, during said conference, and requested Council's authorization to attend. Read by title. Hr. Boyle reported that amendments had been made to the traffic ordinance which clarified the definition of Parades, and correcting the wording in Section
90 (b) regarding application for permits. Therefore, it was moved by Mrs. Gosring,
seconded by Col. Hooker to amend Section 90 Parade regulations, paragraph (a), to read
as follows: "(a) Definitions. 'Parade' means any number of persons marching or walking,
or any number of vehicles moving as a formal or semi-formal body or unit on any street,
public place, alley or sidewalk, except funeral and wedding processions and groups required by law to be so assembled." Motion carried: Ayes 9; Nays 0; Absent 0. Mrsl Geering
also moved to amend Section 90, Parade Regulations, by inserting the words "applications
for" in the third line, after the words "All; thereby causing said sentence to read "All
applications for permits shall be filed with the City Clerk -- etc". Motion seconded by
Col. Hooker and carried on roll call; Ayes 9; Nays 0; Absent 0. Roll was then called on
the Ordinance, as amended, resulting as follows:

Declaring certain slot machines, pinball machines vending machines and devices to be a nuisance, prohibiting the keeping or maintaining for use thereof; providing penalties for violation hereof; and repealing Ordinance No. 10468. Read by title. Mr. Bratrud stated that he had received numerous phon e calls and letters from citizens and Ministers favoring the removal of the pinball machines. He added that he thought there should be an extended time for the effective date of the ordinance, rather than a ten day limit as required by State Law.

Mr. Robert B. Strobel spoke in favor of the Ordinance, as well as G. Hanley Barker, President of the Council of Churches, and both agreed that it would be for the best interest of all that these ordinances (15600 and 15601) be passed.

Attorney A. M. Ursich, representing several pinball operators spoke against the ordinance, and stated he understood the Council members were worried about a monopoly or syndicate controlling the business. He said he had talked to his clients

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and they informed him their businesses were their own and they were not "fronting" for someone else, and would furnish affidavits to this effect, if necessary.

Mayor Tollefson reported he had received letters from David Barnette of the First Baptist Church, Frank E. Brown and Mr. Hill for the Board of Stewards of the First Methodist Church, Obed L. G. Vold, Secretary of the Lutheran Ministerial Association, G. Hanley Barker, oPresident of the Tacoma Council of Churches, and Conald W. Baldwin, Juvenile Protection Chairman of the Tacoma Council of Parents and Teachers, also from G. Hanley Barker of Barker, Inc., and Roger L. Clevenger, Fastor of Plymouth Congregational Church, requesting the passage of the Pinball ordinances.

Reverend Donald Baldwin, Juvenile Protection Chairman of the Tacoma Council of Parents and Teachers, Roger Clevenger, Pastor of Plymouth Congregational Church, Ted Hastings of Pilgrim Congregational Church and Robert Shaw, Pastor of St. Paul's Methodist Church all spoke in favor of the Ordinance.

A discussion was held by the Council as to the effective date of the ordinance, and as a result, it was moved by Mr. Jensen to amend the Ordinance so that the effective date will be December 31, 1956, and that the unased portion of the license fee be refunded. Motion seconded by Mr. Bratrud. Dr. Humiston said he believed the effective date should be earlier, as many of the licenses are due on actober 1st, therefore, he moved to amend the motion by changing December 31st, 1956 to September 30th. Motion seconded by Dr. Battin. A voice vote was called, resulting in loss of the amendment. Roll was called on the original motion, resulting as follows: Ayes 5, Bratrud, Humiston, Jensen, Stojack, Tollefson; Nays 4; Battin, Goering, Hooker and Perdue. Motion carried.Roll was then called on the Ordinance, resulting as follows;

Notion carried on roll call; Ayes 5, Bratrud, Humiston, Jensen, Stojack, Tollefson; Nays 4, Battin, Goering, Hooker and Perdue. Absent 0. Roll was athen called on the Ordinance, resulting as follows:

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

It was moved by Dr. Humiston, seconded by Mr. Perdue that June 19th, 1956 be set as the date for hearing thereon. Motion carried on roll call: Ayes 9; Nays 0; Absent 0. See 42.3

Paul F. Salatino, submitting an appeal from the denial of his license by the City Council on April 23, 1956, and requesting a date be set for hearing before the City Council on said denial. (which was postponed to this date on May 7th) City Manager Boyle stated he had received an application for a taxicab stand location license which had been denied by the License Inspector and Chief Of Police, and in which action he concurred. He stated that inasmuch as the Stand License had been denied by the Police Department, he suggested that the Council concur in the recommendation so that a hearing could be held at the same time on this denial as well as the denial of his Taxicab license. Therefore, it was moved

by Dr. Humiston, seconded by Col. Hooker to concur in the recommendation of the Chief Of Police and City Manager to deny the application of Paul Salatino for a taxicab stand location license, and that hearing be held on both denials on May 21, 1856. Motion carried on roll call: Kyes 9; Nays 0; Absent 0.

Upon motion, duly seconded and carried, Council then adjourned at 10:55 P. M.
