By GOERING:

Commending the Citizens' Bond Committee for its diligent study involved in the reparation and presentation of the various bond issues to the voters.

At this time Hrs. Goering stated that in many of her public appearances she had invited those present to attend Council meetings and had found some of the citizens were under the impression these meetings were not open to the public. She raised the question as to whether or not the City Council could hold its regular meetings in locations other than the City Hall to better acquaint the public with . Council procedure. This suggestion was discussed at length and at the conclusion City Attorney Boyle was asked to submit a report next Monday evening as to whether r not the Council can legally hold its meetings in locations other than the City Hall and what the correct procedure would be in the event this is possible.

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FINAL READING OF ORDINANCES :

Ordinance No. 15154.

Amending Ordinance No. 14793 Satitled: "An ordinance to regulate the location and use of buildings and the use of land within the City of Tacoma; to limit the height of buildings; to prescribe building areas and lines, and the size of yards and other open spaces and for these purposes to divide the City into districts, etc." (ZONING ORDINANCE) by adding thereto a new section to be known as Section SF. (Lots 9 to 16, Block 10 and Lots 17 to 24, Block 5 Fletcher Heights Addition in "C-1" Commercial District, located on both sides of Sixth Avenue extending easterly from Verde 5 treet). (Petition Lester R. Earp). Read in full and passed.

rdinance No. 15155.

Establishing a set of rules to be followed in employing personnel for the Cowlitz Power Development and the Cushman No. 3 Projects. Read by title. It was moved by Dr. Humiston to suspend Rule 9, seconded by Dr. Battin and carried unanimously on voice vote. Mr. Dean Barline, Director of Utilities, Mr. Frank Bannon, Assistant City Aftorney, and Mr. Gavin Lawson, Director of Personnel, were present to explain the ordinance and answer questions of the Council members. The question was raised as to whether the Civil Service Board had reviewed this ordinance, and Mr. Lawson reported that it had been approved by the Civil Service Commission members at their last meeting. Mayor Tollefson asked Mr. Ketler, Business Representative of the Municipal Civil Service League, if had examined and the ordinance, and Mr. Ketler replied in the negative, and added that he would welcome an opportunity to look it over. In view of Mr. Ketler's statement, Mr. Jensen moved to postpone action on the ordinance for one week to allow Mr. Ketler an opportunity to review it before final passage. Motion seconded by Mr. Stojack. It was brought out by the Council that Mr. Ketler had a week in which to look over the ordinance, and that they considered this ample time. Mr. Ketler said that he was not aware that the ordinance had been presented for first reading last week. After discussing the matter, it was pointed that Mr. Ketler had received a copy of both the Agenda and the Minutes of November 1st, which contained this ordinance. In view of this explanation, roll was called on the motion, resulting as follows: Ayes 2; Jensen, Stojack. Nays 6; Battin, Goering, Hooker, Humiston, Perdue, Tollefson. Absent 1; Bratrud. Motion to postpone action on the ordinance for one week was declared lost on roll call. Roll was then called on the passage of the ordinance, resulting as follows;

Dr. Humiston submitted a letter he had received from Dean Barline, Director of Utilities, in reply to his request for information as to whether the work on the <u>Cowlitz River Projects</u> will be done by day labor, force account or contract, which was read in full by the Clerk for the information of the other members of the Council and then ordered placed on file.

Ordinance No. 15156.

Authorizing and directing the City Attorney of the City of Tacoma to purchase certain property for the protection of the water supply of the City of Tacoma in the Green River Water Shed. Read by title. It was moved by Dr. Humiston to suspend Rule), seconded by Mr., Perdue and carried unanimously on voice vote. The ordinance was then passed without having been read in full.

Ordinance No. 15158.

Amending Ordinance No. 14892 entitled: "An ordinance to provide for licensing ind regulating the operation of certain devices, vehicles and things, and the carrying in of certain businesses, callings, professions, trades, occupations and activities in the City of Tacoma; to provide for the suspension and revocation of licenses issued, etc." (CENERAL LICENSE ORDINANCE) by amending Sections 22, 22a, 22b, 22c, 22e, 22g and 22i, and adding thereto a new section to be known as Section 22j. (Licenses for Bicycles). Head by title and placed in order of final reading.

FINISHED BUSINESS:

Mr. Perdue, Chairman of the Audit Committee, presented each Council member with a copy of the 1st Annual report of the City of Tacoma's Running Audit, as prepared Lybrand, Ross Bros. and Montgomery, and read for Council's information the Audit Committee's letter of transmittal.

Hr. Backstrom, City Manager, asked for Council's recommendation as to the disposition of the proposed "Dog Ordinance" which was presented to the Council at $37^{\prime\prime}$ last week's meeting. He asked if Council wished to revise the ordinance before it is considered by them next week or if they preferred that it be left as originally submitted. It was the consensus that the ordinance be considered by Council at next Honday's meeting in the original form and that a public hearing be held at that time.

NEW BUSINESS:

Col. Hooker advised the Council that on Thursday evening, November 11th a special program has been planned for the conclusion of Tacoma's United Good Neighbor Campaign in the College of Puget Sound Field House, and asked all Council members who can to attend this event. He also presented a copy of a proposed proclamation from the Mayor and Council urging the Citizens to support this meeting, and asked for Council's approval of this proclamation. It was moved by Col. Hooker, seconded by Dr. Humiston to approve the Proclamation, and carried unanimously on roll call.

Upon motion. duly seconded and carried, Council adjourned at 9:30 P. M.
