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FIRST READING OF ORDINANCES:

Ordinance No. 20313 Amending Title 11 of the Official Code by adding Sections 11.06.065 and 11.12.110 relative to traffic.

Robert Hamilton, City Attorney, advised that the ordinance increases the penalty for serious driving convictions, such as hit and run and driving while intoxicated.

Ordinance No. 20314

Appropriating the sum of \$32,950.00, or so much thereof as may be necessary from the Federal Shared Revenue Fund for the purpose of operating the Central City Learning Center to be administered by the Human Development Department.

Mel Jackson, Director of the Human Development Department, advised that the ordinance would continue a project that was in operation last year and found to be successful.

The Ordinance was set over for final reading next week.

Ordinance No. 20315

Appropriating the sum of \$5,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, from the Federal Shared Revenue Fund for the purpose of operating the Eastside Community Center Project to be administered by the Human Development Department.

Mel Jackson advised that the ordinance would continue a project that was in operation last year and found to be successful.

Ordinance No. 20316

Appropriating the sum of \$11,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, from the Federal Shared Revenue Fund for the purpose of operating a Big Brothers Project to be administered by the Human Development Department.

Mel Jackson advised that the ordinance would continue a project that was in operation last year and found to be successful.

Dick White, Director of the Project, described the program and its great success and answered questions of Council members.

The Ordinance was set over for final reading next week.

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Ordinance No. 20317

Appropriating the sum of \$349,451.00, or so much thereof as may be necessary from the Federal Shared Revenue Fund for the purpose of establishing and operating the Emergency Jobs Program, Title VI of CETA (Manpower) to be administered by the City Clerk-General Services Department, and declaring an emergency making necessary the passage of this ordinance and its taking effect immediately upon publication.

Severo Esquivel, Assistant to the City Manager, advised that the Ordinance appropriates revenue sharing funds to carry out the CETA Title VI projects, which would employ semi-skilled and unskilled persons. Council members, at yesterday's study session, had asked that revisions be made which would result in changes in the amount of revenue sharing funds to be used for this project at this time. Accordingly, the figure on the ordinance should read \$111,096. The breakdown would be salaries, \$7,495, maintenance and operation, \$97,761 and capital outlay, \$5,840.

Mr. Warnick moved that the ordinance be amended to read \$111,096 and the other figures quoted also be inserted in the ordinance. Seconded by Mr. Moss. Voice vote was taken and carried.

The Ordinance, as amended, was set over for final reading next week.

Purchase Resolution No. 23188

Awarding contract to: (1) Air Systems Engineering, Inc. on its bid of \$7,709.10 for air conditioning system; and rejecting all bids on one (1) Ladder Truck for the Fire Department as they exceed the estimate by more than 10 percent.

Bernie Gayle, Property Management & Insurance Supervisor, asked that the Resolution be continued for one week in order to correct some discrepancies in the legal description in the Resolution.

Resolution No. 2 3195

Establishing policy and procedure for affirmative action in employment of minorities and women in bodies receiving funds allocated by the City Council or operating programs and services in concert with the City of Tacoma.

Mrs. Egan moved that the Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Mr. Sonntag. Voice vote was taken and carried. The Resolution was declared adopted.

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REPORTS BY CITY MANAGER:

Bill Donaldson requested that a waiver of the residence requirement be granted for Robert Backstein, whose is being employed in the unclassified position of Hearings Examiner.

Mr. Sonntag moved that the request be granted. Seconded by Mr. Warnick. Voice vote was taken and carried.

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COMMENTS BY MEMBERS OF THE CITY COUNCIL:

Mr. Sonntag advised that the proposal for the reorganization of the Puget Sound Governmental Conference will be discussed at the Study Session next Monday, January 27, 1975. Attending the Study Session will be staff persons from King County who have staffed the Spellman Committee and one staff member from the Conference itself to answer questions of Council members.

Mr. Sonntag reminded Council that the Summer Youth Employment Program for 1975 will be before the Council some time in February and anyone who has misplaced the study report distributed previously may secure a copy from Mr. Ray Corpuz. He asked Mr. Donaldson to determine and furnish a date when the Police Officers staffing the Jail will be replaced by civilians. He also wished to thank the washington State Poet's Association for a book, which was distributed to Council.

Mr. Moss commented that he had walked on Schuster Parkway and found it to be beautiful and a credit to Tacoma.

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CITIZENS REQUESTS TO BE HEARD:

Mr. David L. Kilber spoke on three of the Labor Party's food and energy bills on which he presented a proposed resolution asking Council to adopt and submit to Congress.

Mr. Sonntag requested Mr. Donaldson to have staff prepare a letter expressing a positive thought for all three of the proposals for signatures of those Council members who wish to sign and that the letter be forwarded to Representative Hicks with copies to both Senators of the State of Washington.

Tom Wells spoke on local and national air quality management.
