Restricted parking District North E Street between Division Avenue and North 1st). lead in full. A report was submitted from E. C. Bashey, Director of Public Works, advising that the proposed ordinance yould allow more parking spaces for patrons of the Young Apartments and visitors to Stadium High by restricting time limit to two hours instead of the present unrestricted parking, and that a loading zone for the Young spartments would not be necessary with this restriction; stating that the no parking restrictions between 4 P. M. and 6.P. M. will still be required to carry the heavy volume of traffic leaving the central business district, and recommending the passage of the ordinance. A loading zone in front of the Young Apartments was discussed and there seemed to be a difference of opinion between Mr. Jensen and Col. Hooker as to whether or not the owners and apartment manager wanted this zone. It was moved by Mr. Jensen, seconded by Mr. Stojack that the ordinance be laid over for one week to July 19th to study the problem of loading zones at the Young Apartments and to get a recommendation of letter from the owner of the building.

INFINISHED BUSINESS:

The program on Mental Health in Vocational Rehabilitation presented by Dr. C. R. Fargher, Director of Health, at Council meeting of July 6th and tabled until this date by motion of Council, was brought up at this time.
