Dear Sir:-

On January 12, 1916, by the provisions of Ordinance No. 6203, a contract was entered into between the Tacoma Railway & Power Company and the City of Tacoma, covering the interchange of power between the two parties to the contract for the purpose of protecting each other in case of breakdowns at the plants or shortage of water supply. This contract provides that any deficiency in output of the La Grande plant due to breakdowns at the plant or shortage of water is to be supplied by the Tacoma Railway & Power Company up to 17,000 horse power at the rates fixed in the ordinance.

Since the execution of this contract the City has very greatly increased its load beyond the capacity of the La Grande Plant, and we are obliged to notify you that this Company is not now in a position to furnish the City of Tacoma current in excess of the amount and for the purposes provided for under this contract at the rates stipulated in that ordinance.

For any power supplied to make up for water shortage at the existing La Grande plant or to take care of emergencies up to the capacity of that plant, we will continue to furnish power under the terms and conditions of Ordinance No. 6203 unless and until the contract is terminated as provided in that ordinance. For any power supplied to the City of Tacoma, in addition to this, we will make an agreement with the City to supply the current required for contract amount, provided we have it available, for yearly periods at the following rates:

- \$36.00 per K.W. of Demand per Year,
- Plus energy charge of 6.8 mills for water generated power
- Plus energy charge of 3.4 mills for steam generated power.

The amount of power that the City desires the Company to reserve for its use during any yearly period shall be established at the beginning of such yearly period and shall be the contract amount to be furnished for that year.

In the absence of any agreement as to the contract amount, this amount shall be for any year the difference between the maximum demand on the city's system for the previous December - and the rated capacity of the La Grande plant.

The monthly payment by the City to the Company shall be one-twelfth of the demand charge for the contract amount as above, plus the charge for energy consumed during the month.

Beginning January 1, 1922, the above rate will be effective for the contract amount of power to be furnished for the year 1922 in excess of that provided for by the terms of Ordinance No. 6203.

Dear Sir:-

I have your letter of December 30th with reference to the furnishing of power to the City of Tacoma under the Contract between the City and the Tacoma Railway & Power Company, dated January 12th, 1916.

That contract provided that whenever by reason of any accident or disability of the generating plants of either party, whether caused by scarcity of water or any other cause, it shall be unable to produce and furnish the quantity of electric current necessary to supply its extreme, upon demand etc the Company will furnish to the City such power as the City may need up to 10,000 H.P. The contract has been in operation for five years and during all of that period it has been construed by the City to mean that whenever it was necessary to have additional power, for any reason it would be furnished and the Company has accepted that construction for five years and has acted in accordance therewith and has furnished the City with additional power up to 10,000 H.P. and in excess of that amount at the rate specified in said contract.

It comes therefore as a complete surprise to me, that you should at this late date place an entirely different construction upon the contract and upon notice of one day put into effect a rate and a basis for a charge that will necessitate the expenditure of more than ten times as much by the city for the same amount of power that you have been furnishing, and I am wholly unable to accept the construction which you now place upon the provisions of the



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existing contract, and feel that the City must insist upon a completion of the contract in accordance with the construction thereof which has obtained and which has been acted upon by both parties for five years.

I would regret very much to have the amicable relations which have existed between the City and the Company with respect to this contract for five years give way to contention, but if the Company insists upon taking the steps outlined in your letter beginning on January 1st, 1922, it will result in a great deal of loss, hardship and annoyance to the citizens of Tacoma and a very great added expense to the Light Department and therefore I feel that the City Council should be advised of the situation and in the meantime I would request that you defer the action you have indicated until the Council can meet and discuss the situation which cannot take place until Tuesday next.

Could you not meet with the Council at a time suitable to your convenience and discuss the whole situation. In the meantime, I feel that I would not be justified in recognizing any other or different construction of the terms of the existing contract than that which has been acquiesced in by all parties concerned from January 13th, 1916, to the present time.

The matter of street car transfers was discussed, Mr. Sullivan promising transfer privileges at all intersections on Broadway and Pacific Avenue from South 7th to 17th Street, and an additional cable stop at 12th and Broadway.

A statement from the Tacoma Railway & Power Company was read by Mr. Sullivan, a written copy of which was to be filed with the City Council for deliberation. In answer to the question, "Would this proposition be considered as that of the Puget Sound Power & Light Company?" Mr. Sullivan answered "Yes". Discussion of the interpretation of the agreement between the City and the Power Company, made in 1916, was brought up, Mr. Sullivan insisting that it was the intention of the company to limit its obligation to furnish current only.

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during periods of disability at the La Grande plant. Mr. Sullivan further stated that, if the company had at times permitted current to be used by the city, this was by sufferance and did not alter the terms of the contract. A discussion ensued relative to the rate set forth in the communication of Mr. Sullivan, who stated that he doubted if any other municipality was getting a lower rate. In answer to the question of the estimated surplus of the company, Mr. Sullivan replied that last winter's peak showed from 25,000 to 30,000 surplus horsepower. He also stated that when his company could no longer sell for 10¢ less than the Cushman power would cost, a notice of five years to the City would be agreed to in order that the city might prepare the Cushman site; or, an arrangement for the purchase of current for a definite period of twenty-five years might be entered into. Mr. Sullivan then promised to extend the terms of the old contract until March 1, 1922, giving the Council ample time to consider his proposal as read, a copy of which would be filed with the Council not later than Tuesday, January 17th. In the course of further discussion of the proposition submitted by the company, Mr. Sullivan was asked if the City might also have the privilege of giving the Power Company five years notice for discontinuance of service, to which he replied emphatically, "No". Further consideration of the proposition was deferred until the communication was filed.

A delegation from several civic bodies of the city presented a proposed amendment to Ordinances 6406 and 2239, relating to signs on the streets, and elsewhere. The proposed ordinance was referred to the Committee of the Whole and the City Attorney for examination.

Commissioner Davisson presented the advisability of street lights at South 36th and Puget Sound, South 36th and Warner and South 36th and Lawrence. Inasmuch as no petition had been filed for action, it was moved by Mr. Davisson, seconded and carried, that the Council authorize this extension to the light service.

Commissioner Harrison outlined a plan for a city asphalt plant at South 23d and Winthrop Streets, stating that operation of such a plant would greatly reduce the cost of city paving. In relation to this Mr. Putnam stated that the surface asphalt could probably be made for one dollar per yard by the city, which is an amount much less than the present contract price; that a one-unit plant would cost approximately \$17,000 and would be ready for operation in about ninety days. Mr. Harrison stated that an extra superintendent would be necessary in connection with the plant and that he plans to introduce a resolution for this purpose, Mr. Putnam having in mind a man well qualified to act as superintendent. No definite action was taken by the Council at this time, Mr. Harrison stating that the necessary ordinances and resolution would be introduced at a later date.

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## SPECIAL SESSION

COUNCIL CHAMBER, 11:30 A.M.,  
MONDAY, FEBRUARY 6, 1922

Council convened in special legislative session, pursuant to the following call:

"To the City Council of the  
City of Tacoma.

Gentlemen:-

I have called this special meeting of the Council today on account of the emergency that exists at the gauging station near Lake Cushman.

About four years ago the City of Tacoma in conjunction with the United States Geological Survey established a gauging station near what is known as the rangers' bridge. The purpose of this gauging station was to determine exactly the volume of water in the river, and therefore, the amount of power that the Cushman plant would develop.

According to the report received over the telephone this morning from R. T. Birch, the Director of Fisheries, Ernest A. Seaborg, has sent men up there to do some blasting on City property right near the gauging station, the effect of which will be to absolutely destroy the value of the gauging station. The blasting of last week, I considered along the same line of petty work being done by Sims, Seaborg and the other members of the Fishery Board, and on that account paid little attention to it.

If the reports received, however, are true in regard to the blasting, it is evidently a concerted effort to destroy the efficiency of our plant, and until the attorneys are able to get an injunction in force, I think that it is absolutely right that the City send men up there to protect the property, using all the force that is necessary to keep trespassers and others off the property, no matter who they pretend to represent.

Mr. Hays of the Park Board agreed with the suggestions but stated that it was financially impossible for the Park Board to make this change at this time, with little hope for such an expenditure for at least five years. Measuring the water used at Wright Park by the metered service at Lincoln Park was suggested. Commissioner Davison finally agreed to the Park Board's proposal that they be permitted to use the water at the present rate provided all sprinkling, as well as refilling fish pond and bathing pools, be done after eight o'clock at night. Mr. Hays promised to submit a letter to this effect for the Council to act upon.

A motion that the Committee arise and report to the Council was seconded and carried.

WHEREAS, the rates quoted by the Tacoma Ry. & Power Company in their communication of December 29, 1921, are of such a nature as would necessitate an advance of the present rates now obtaining in the City of Tacoma; NOW, THEREFORE,

On motion of Mr. Harrison the regular order of business was suspended in order to take up the hearings in which the tax payers present were interested.

## UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

This being the date to which the hearing against the proposed improvement in Local Improvement District 1154, for a combined sanitary and storm water trunk sewer in So. Tacoma was continued, the report of the committee of engineers, signed by W. A. Kunigh, L. Evans, and Norton L. Taylor, was read. Five plans for trunk sewer for So. Tacoma were submitted, and the plan found most economical and practical to provide a combined sanitary and storm water drainage system for the district under consideration is the one outlined under Plan #1 as proposed by the City Engineer in Resolution 7232. A supplementary report from Norton L. Taylor was also read, recommending the construction of a tunnel from the vicinity of South 33th Street and the Edison Slough in a northwesterly direction to a point in Section 34, Township 22 N., R. 2 E., thence to the Narrows, where the rapid current will not allow accumulation at the point of discharge. The City Engineer reported that 13.27% of the property in the district was represented on the remonstrances checked. Remonstrances just filed, containing several hundred names, were referred to the engineer for checking. It was moved by Mr. Harrison that property owners present be heard and that final action on Local Improvement District 1154 be deferred until Wednesday, November 22nd. Motion seconded and carried. Representatives from the West End Improvement Club, in the Franklin School district, and a resident from the vicinity of South 40th and Park Avenue spoke in favor of the improvement as a means for securing relief from inadequate drainage. Remonstrances were heard from property owners in the 6th Addition and South Tacoma and by representatives of the Wilkeson Street Community Club, the Heights Co. and residents in Section 18. Persons desiring to remonstrate were requested by the Council to file their written remonstrances not later than Wednesday, November 22nd at 9 o'clock A. M. and the hearing was continued until 10 o'clock on that date.

The regular order of business was suspended in order to take up the hearings in which the tax payers present were interested.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

This being the date to which the hearing against the proposed improvement in Local Improvement District 1154, for a combined sanitary and storm water trunk sewer in So. Tacoma, was continued, the report of the City Engineer on remonstrances was read. He stated that the remonstrances checked covered 14.95% of the property in the district and that this check does not include remonstrances in which no property description was given. A representative of the West End Improvement Club asked for a continuance of thirty days, stating that residents in his district had learned in the last few days that they were effected by this improvement and that they wished more time in which to present their side of the case.
