Resolution 951 - L I D No. 5059

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:

That it is the intention of said council to order the Local Improvement herein after set forth, and to levy and collect special assessments to pay the cost and expense of such improvement, upon the real property which is hereinafter described, to the extent that such property shall be benefited thereby.

That said improvement shall consist of an Eight (8) Inch Wooden Water Main on Proctor Street, from North 19th Street to North 21st Street.

A Six (6) Inch Wooden Water Main on North 19th Street, from Proctor Street to Stevens Street.

A Six (6) Inch Wooden Water Main on Stevens Street, from North 19th Street to North 24th Street, together with the Necessary gates, tees, hydrants, specials, etc.,

Where an Eight (8) Inch main is laid the difference in cost between a Six (6) inch and an Eight (8) inch main, shall be paid by the Water Department.

That the real property to be benefited by said improvement, and which will constitute Local Improvement District No. 5059, is described as follows, to-wit:

The East one-half of Blocks 66-81-96-101, the West one-half of Blocks 67-82-97-102, the South one-half of Blocks 97-98-99-100-101, the North one-half of Blocks 112-113-114-115-116, Amended Map of the Second School Land Addition to Tacoma, W.T.

The assessments levied against said lots and property to become due and payable at the option of the property owners, in five (5) equal, annual installments, with interest at the rate of six (6%) per annum on deferred payments.

That the work of said improvement be done and said special assessments be levied and collected in the manner provided by Chapter 98 of the Acts of the Legislature of the State of Washington of 1911, and Ordinance No. 4611 of said City.

All proposals shall be made upon printed forms prepared by the Commissioner of such Department, and furnished gratuitously upon application with a form for the affidavit provided for in Section 117 of this Charter printed hereon; and each bid shall be accompanied by an affidavit as provided in said Section. On the day and hour specified in said notice inviting sealed proposals, all bids shall be delivered to the Commissioner by the bidder or his agent within the two hours named in the advertisement, and the award on said bids shall in all cases be made to the lowest and best bidder, and in the manner, so far as applicable, as set out in Section 118 of this Charter.

Provided, that nothing contained in this section or elsewhere in this charter shall prevent the Council from creating a department for the purchase of all or part of the materials and supplies required by the several departments and from appointing a purchasing agent at the head thereof."

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

This being the time to which the hearing upon Local Improvement District 5029 was continued, the Superintendent of Water reported that 4.37% of the property owners in the district had remonstrated against the improvement. Moved by Davison that the City Attorney be instructed to draft ordinance providing for the improvement.

This being the time set for hearing remonstrances against the improvement proposed in Local Improvement District 5010, the Superintendent of Water reported that 15.31% of the property owners in the district had remonstrated against the improvement. Moved by Davison that the remonstrance be sustained relative to that portion of the improvement between Puget Sound Avenue and Lawrence Street, and the City Attorney be instructed to draft ordinance providing for the improvement between Proctor Street and Puget Sound Avenue.

NEW BUSINESS.

C. C. Doud appeared relative to extension of city water to Plant of Doud-McFarland Co., in vicinity of Center Street. The request was referred to the Commissioner of Light & Water, the Council endorsing his action in the matter.

Mr. Poe appeared before the Council relative to the extension of the car line on the bridge over the Hylebos Waterway, with a spur to a prospective factory site. The Commissioners agreed to place the rail and grant the privilege of the spur, provided the County would waive its demand for \$17,000.00 from the City, one-half the cost of said bridge, to be paid at the time of using same. It was agreed that the traffic committee, familiar with this matter, be consulted, and requested to interview the County Commissioners relative to a waiver of this condition.

Commissioner Davison brought up the matter of a Conditional Bill of Sale to the City of certain property in the Clover Creek District, stating that if the Bill of Sale served only to quiet the title of Mrs. Ward, the present owner, he would advise the City taking such action as would clear the title. The property is described as follows:

Thirty-three feet on each side of a certain line described as follows, to-wit: Beginning at a point on the West boundary line of the L. J. Keach Donation Land Claim No. 61 and 67 Sections 1 and 6, Township 19, North of Ranges 2 and 3 East Willamette Meridian, 490 feet South of the Northwest corner of said claim and run thence variation used E 1 1/4 degrees East; N. 52 degrees W 179 feet; thence North 43 degrees and 45' W 171 feet; thence N 31 degrees and 15' W 580 feet; thence N 53 degrees and 15' W 505 feet; thence N 44 degrees W 300 feet; thence N 39 degrees 45' W 500 feet; thence N 34 degrees 30' W 133 feet; thence N 46 degrees 15' W 67 feet to a point on the south line of Lot two, section 1, Township 19 and 20 North Range 2 East, containing 3 and 69/100 acres.

The City Clerk was requested to bring the Ordinance to the committee of the whole meeting called Wednesday afternoon at 3 P. M., at which time the matter of the enforcement, or the amending of this Ordinance, could be discussed in full.

Resolution 7033

WHEREAS, more than two weeks prior to the first Monday in September, A.D., 1920, the several officers of the City of Tacoma filed with the Chief Auditing Officer of said City of Tacoma, to-wit: the City Controller, an itemized estimate of all the expenditures required by their respective departments for the ensuing year; and

WHEREAS, in addition to the estimated amount required for the maintenance of his department for the ensuing year, the Chief Auditing Officer of said City of Tacoma also prepared an estimate of the revenues of said City other than taxes that are likely to accrue to said City of Tacoma, the various amounts required to meet interest and redemption payments, the necessity for Sinking Funds and the net amount of the surplus and deficit as established at the close of the previous fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, the estimated budget together with a notice to the effect that the governing officials, to-wit: the City Council of the City of Tacoma, would meet at their office on the first Monday of October, A.D., 1920, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon for the purpose of considering the various schedules contained therein, was duly published in the official newspaper of said City of Tacoma once each week for two consecutive weeks next following said first Monday in September; in which notice it was stated that all persons interested would be given an opportunity for a full and complete discussion of the matters set forth in the estimated budget as published; and

WHEREAS, the City Council have fully considered said estimates and have deliberated thereon, and from such consideration and deliberation it appears to the satisfaction of the governing body of the City of Tacoma, to-wit: the City Council, that the maintenance and operation of the several governmental departments of said City of Tacoma for the ensuing year will and does require the adoption of the budget for said several departments of said City as hereinafter more particularly set forth and itemized; and that the interest upon the bonded indebtedness of said City and the necessary Sinking Funds required by law to be provided for and maintained will and do necessitate the adoption of each item of the estimated budget providing therefor, as finally agreed upon and which is hereinafter more particularly itemized and set forth; and

WHEREAS, the consideration of said various estimates have now been finally concluded and each item of the estimated budget has been fully and carefully considered; and after computing the total expenditures and deducting from this result the revenues of said City other than taxes, the said City Council has finally agreed upon each item of the budget hereinafter set forth and the proper amount therefor; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:

That the following budget be and it is hereby adopted as the budget of the City
