He added, the site is adjacent to a commercial district on the west, apartment zone on the south and a proposed high school to the cast. MMENTS:

Mr. Rowlands announced that the regular Council meeting will be held on Incaday, November 8th, 1967 at 4:00 P. M. instead of Tuesday as Nov. 7th will election day. No study session will be held on Monday.

Mr. Finnigan brought up that the 11th and 15th Street bridges were opened tied up traffic for hours during the day, and wondered what was the trouble. Mr. Schuster, Director of Public Works, explained that the Union Pacific load Co. was attempting to repair a locking device on the 15th St. bridge looped to have the span in a closed position by Wednesday. He was informed lative to this Tuesday morning at 9:30 A. M. and he said the State Highway latiment was doing some work on the 11th Street Bridge also

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Mr. Cvitanich asked what was the status of the sewer development in the Port dustrial area. He noted he had mentioned this problem a number of times but had heard a candidate for the Port Commission say that the City was responsible enforcing tideflats sewage control. The charge was made that raw sewage is ing dumped into Puget Sound. He felt the Council was being short-sighted in not contring the Port to install sewers when they are spending millious on development.

Mr. Rowlands stated a report would be forthcoming as to what is being done. Mr. Cvitanich asked if the enforcement is a City problem

Mr. Rowlands said the portion of the tideflats that is inside the City would the City's responsibility.

Mr. Schuster explained that a number of the plants have permits from the see Health Dept. for waste disposal as well as spetic tanks.

Mayor Tollefson explained that this matter was discussed sometime ago, as to other the Port, in its land development program should be forced to put sewers book up with the interceptor. The City of Tacoma and the Port had submitted application for federal participation and this was turned down because of lack funds.

Mr. Rowlands remarked that they are again trying under a different program.

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Mr. Tinnigan asked who had purchased the Thomas Autometer for measuring Sphur dioxide concentration that had been parked at the County City Bldg Mr. Rowlands said it was an expense of the regional authority. The Fority is about a munch away from adopting an ordinance, and at the present .. it is studying analyses made of the proposed ordinance by industries

Rr. Pinnigan asked about the sprinkler system problem which has been cussed many times. He had hoped that an ordinance requiring sprinklers in escial and institutional budilings would have been a reality by now. Mr. Rowlands explained that changes were being proposed in the building sty code, but that industry had balked at the cost factor. He added, he ed try to have a report within the next two weeks, but would try to have a ort this Friday on the proposal of the Utility Dept. relative to installing ers in nursing homes, rest homes & hospitals for sprinkler systems. Mr. Rowlands said an ordinance could be brought in relative to this, but he d also like an ordinance drafted for water mains in So. 19th and Union Ave. to the problems in that area.

Mr. Cvitatich urged the City staff to persuade the school officials to ver one of the Bowls for athletics within the City.

Mayor Tollefson brought up the question of bus passes for the elderly. He charked that a suggestion had been made that a charge of \$3.00 a month be de for those elderly persons who live outside the City limits, and that ay pay the extra fare which is required by extra travel. He added, there is ordinance at this time before the Council but he wished the Council to consider s proposal and then come in with a recommendation. Mr. Bott asked about other locations for selling the passes this month. Mr. Rowlands stated, it was Mr. Putman's suggestion that the one location be used. He remarked that Mr. Bond, Public Relation's officer, has been clong with Mr. Hendry, Transit Director, and a report should be made to the s cil within the near future.

Mr. Bott suggested that recepticles be placed on the downtown street corners persons who receive a \$1.00 Parking ticket so they would not have to come up · the County-City Building.

There being no further business to come before the Council, upon motion duly ended and passed the meeting adjourned at 6:20 P. M.
