CITY COUNCIL MINUTES

City Council Chambers, 4:00 P. M. Tuesday, July 13, 1965

Council met in regular session. Present on roll call 8: Bott, Finnigan, Haley, Herrmann, Johnson, Murtland, Price and Mayor Tollefson. Absent 1, Cvitanich. Mr. Cvitanich coming in at 4:05 P. M.

Mr. Haley moved that the minutes of the meeting of June 29, 1965 be approved as submitted. Seconded by Mr. Cvitanich. Voice vote taken. Motion carried.

Mr. Rowlands presented a \$25,00 award to Mr. William G. Koenigslieb of the Public Works Department for his suggestion for rebuilding of wire gravel brooms and to Mr. Joe Sharek of the Public Works Department a \$100 award for his suggestion for the purchase of used cars and trucks from other agencies.

The recipients were congratulated by the City Manager, Mayor

Tollefson and the Council members.

HEARINGS & APPEALS:

a. This is the date set for hearing on the petition submitted by Nickum Properties, Inc. for the resoning of property located at the N. E. corner of So. 37th and Sheridan Ave. from an "R-2" to a "C-1" District.

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Mayor Tollesson stated a communication has been received from H. G. Swendsen, Executive Vice President of Nickum Properties Inc., requesting a three week's continuance of the hearing as they would like to work out some problems prior to the hearing.

Dr. Herrmann moved to postpone the hearing until August 3, 1965 Seconded by Mr. Haley. Voice vote taken. Motion carried.

b. This is the date set for hearing on the petition submitted by the University of Puget Sound for the vacation of No. 14th St. between Union Ave. and Washington St.

Mr. Smith, Vice President of U. P. S., stated the University wishes to utilize this additional space for off-street parking between eight group dormitories. He added, the student car ratio is one car to every two students which is continually increasing. He said the vacation of the street will allow the University to control the traffic between these fraternity houses. He thought in reference to the LID on North 14th St. between Washington St. and Union Ave., it would be useless to have the expense of an LID and later find that the area is to be used for parking. The University owns all of the property abutting the proposed vacation, except one parcel of property and that owner is in favor of the vacation.

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Dr. Herrmann asked if widening of the street had been considered to the extent that it would provide angle parking and still allow traffic to proceed on the open street,

Mr. Smith said this has been discussed with the staff of the Public Works Dept. and it was determined that the width is not sufficient for that type of

arrangement

The following were present protesting the proposed vacation. Mr. Wayne Richard, residing at 4205 No. 14th St.; Mr. Martin Potter, residing at 2820 No Warner; Mr. MacShane, residing at 1617 No. Proctor, owner of 110 feet on No. 14th St.; Mr. F. Doss, residing at 420, No. 14th; Mrs. K. Ronson residing at 3801 No. 14th St.

Mr. Johnson asked Mr. McCormick, City Attorney, if the Council could legally vacate this street in view of the fact that a local improvement was

initiated a few months, ago,

Mr. McCormick replied that a few months ago the Council and the property owners in good faith created this district. When the district was created it extended from Proctor St. to Union Ave. on 14th St. and many of the residents signed the petition on the basis that it would be a connecting link to Union Ave. from Proctor Street. The contract was let for the paving, then the question arose as to whether or not it would be advisable in the event the street were to be vacated for the school as it would be a waste of money. At that time there was a meeting with Dr. Thompson, the contractor and the staff. It was called to their attention that there were legal problems and questions as to whether or not, after the L I D had been formed and the contract let, whether a section of the street could be deleted, particularly when it was a main connecting link to the rest of the project. It was determined under the circumstances, there was a valid reason for the vacation, and perhaps, a method could be worked out with the property owners. However, there is now opposition to the vacation of the street by the original petitioners of the district.

Mr. McCormick continued, there is no question if this street is paved and conditions develop in a few years tenffic wise, the City Council could have the power to vacate if they wished. He thought this would be a very serious legal question as to the vacation at this time; to delete a section of a project that is once formed. There isn't any question as to the power of the Council to vacate, but there maybe some question on the liability of the property owners to pay their

assessments when the roll is approved.

Mr. Finnigan thought the Council would be remiss in approving the vacation of 14th Street now because it is a traveled street from one area to another. The property owners have shown by having the street paved their desire to make their area more attractive and to provide a better means for traffic.

Several Council members agreed with Mr. Finnigan as it was a well

traveled street it should remain open to the public.

Mr. Finnigan moved to deny the petition for the vacation of North 14th St. between Union Ave. and Washington Street. Seconded by Mr. Johnson. Voice vote was taken. Motion carried.

c. This is the date set for hearing on the denial of the petition submitted by Fred Shuffield for the resoning of property located as the N. W. corner of the intersection of So. 47th and Cedar from an "R-3" to an "R-4-L" District.

After some discussion Mrs. Price moved to overrule the recommendation of the Planning Commission and that the "R-4-L" resoning be approved. Seconded by Mr. Johnson.

Some of the Council members inquired about the reversion clause of the

resonings.

Mr. Buehler, Director of Planning, replied that the staff was working on an Ordinance and the Planning Commission will hold a public hearing prior to it being referred to the City Council.

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Mr. Rowlands stated he hoped to have the Ordinance before the City Council within 3 to 4 weeks after it clears through the Planning Commission.

Roll call was taken on the motion to draft an ordinance approving the resoning. Ayes 6; Nays 3, Haley, Herrmann and Mayor Tollefson; Absent 0.

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Mr. Civitanich left at 5:55 P. M.

d. The City Planning Commission recommending the denial of the petition submitted by Geo. D. Poe & Co. for the rezoning of property located on the north side of No. 33rd west of Shirley St. from an "R-2" to an "R-4" District.

An appeal has been filed by Geo. D. Poe.

Dr. Herrmann moved that August 17, 1965 be set as the date for hearing on the denial of the petition submitted by Geo. D. Poe & Co. Seconded by Mr. Haley. Voice vote taken. Mo tion carried.

Mr. Finnigan moved that the Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Mr. Haley.

The Resolution was passed unanimously by voice vote. Ayes 8; Nays 0; Absent 1, Cvitanich.

Resolution No. 18363

Authorizing the City Manager to execute for and on behalf of the City an application for obtaining certain Federal Financial assistance under the Federal Disaster Act.

Mr. Haley moved that the Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Dr. Herrmann.

The Resolution was passed unanimously by voice vote. Ayes 8; Nays 0; Absent 1, Cvitanich.

Resolution No. 18364

Authorizing an amendatory application for loan and grant contract between the City of Tacoma and the United States of America for Project No. Wash. R-14.

Dr. Herrmann moved that the Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Mrs. Price.

The Resolution was passed unanimously by voice vote.

Ayes 7; Nays 0; Absent 2; Cvitanich, Johnson (temporarily)

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Resolution No. 18365

Awarding contract for the annual supply of fire hose to American Rubber Co. on its bid of \$4734.85 incl. sales tax.

Mr. Haley moved that the Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Mr. Finnigan.

The Resolution was passed unanimously by voice vote. Ayes 8; Nays 0; Absent 1, Cvitanich.

Resolution No. 18366

Approving the revision of limited access on a portion of Primary State Highway No. 1 (SR-5) on the west and east sides of the 56th St. interchange.

Mr. Haley moved that the Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Mr. Finnigan.

The Resolution was passed unanimously by voice vote. Ayes 8; Nays 0; Absent 1, Cvitanich.

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ITEMS FILED IN THE OFFICE OF THE CITY CLERK:

Report from the Tacoma Pierce County Health Dept. for Jan. -March, 1965.

COMMENTS:

Mr. Haley said he was encouraged by an article which appeared in the News Tribune regarding the viaduct across lith St. to provide a fast route across the Tideflats. He said up to this time the Port officials have not indicated the feasibility of such a viaduct, but this has been under discussion by the City Council for a good number of years. He said it was published in the News Tribune that plans for a double viaduct across lith St. were revealed by Mr. Raymond, President of the Port of Tacoma, to the members of the Chamber of Commerce at Federal Way.

Mr. Haley asked that the City Manager, direct the City staff to contact the Port Officials immediately toward the continued development of this program for a viaduct.

Mr. Finnigan said he recalled a little over a year ago Mr. Raymond forwarded a letter to the Council indicating that a bridge would be constructed across Lincoln Ave.on a temporary basis, then a few weeks later they decided that it was too expensive. He said he couldn't share Mr. Haley's confidence in the Port official's comment.

Mr. Haley said the City is ready and willing to cooperate with the Port and he would like the report to be submitted to the City Council in the next few weeks in writing on the attitude of the Port officials toward this whole project on the 2nd waterway crossing, of the complete area of the industrial flats.

Mr. Finnigan asked when the Paget Sound Transportation Study will be completed.

Mayor Tollefson said there are a couple of chapters left to be prepared y^y and they are scheduled for completion toward the end of the month.

There being no further business to come before the Council, upon motion duly seconded and passed, the meeting adjourned at 6:20 P. M.
