Resolution No. 15162:

By PERDUE:

Authorizing the City Attorney to enter into a stipulation with the United states Attorney for payment by Bonneville Power Administration to the City the sum \$77, 155.00 for the taking of an easement for right of way for an electric power cansmission line 125 feet wide, extending southerly from the Cowlitz Substation, oproximately 6 miles.

Mayor Anderson asked Mr. Barline if he would brief the Council on the solution.

Mr. Barline said the request for the Resolution was thoroughly explanatory. He said this was a piece of property the City has just acquired which extends from the South Tacoma Switching Station to the Cowlitz Substation. He advised that the City meeds this additional right of way, as well as the Bonneville Power Administration, so they can build a new tie to the Bonneville transmission line into the Cowlitz substation. Heather than each of them acquiring the property individually, there was a mutual understanding that the City acquire all of the property, then transfer to Bonneville Power Administration the portion they need, he added. "This is done strictly on a percentage Dasis", he said. The area Bonneville Power Administration proposes to acquire is 42.49% of the acreage--they are paying the City 42.49% of the total cost, which is 5181,000.

Vacating that portion of the half-street abutting the west side of Block 5, Edward P. Miller's 1st Addition. (property beginning at the centerline of Sprague Avenue and South 17th Street.) Read by title and passed.

Ordinance No. 15983:

Creating and establishing the appointive position of Assistant Director of Finance; providing for the method of appointment and declaring a public emergency making necessary the immediate passage of this ordinance and the taking effect thereof immediately after publication. Read by title.

Mayor Anderson asked Mr. C. A. Gaisford, Director of Finance, if there was someone in his office that could be advanced to this position.

Mr. Gaisford advised that this was a specialized field in Tax Auditing, and that no one in his office was qualified for the position. He added that this was made a general classification so that the person appointed could, not only work in the Business and Occupation Tax Office but could fill in, in the five positions in the Finance Office as well.

Mayor Anderson then asked Mr. Gatsford if there was anyone in his office who was more or less an assistant to him.

Mr. Gaisford advised there was no one, but, he said, he had a Chief Accounting Officer, Tony Bezer, who acts. The only other appointive position in this office is the City Treasurer, who is appointed by the City Manager.

ITEMS RECEIVED FOR FILING IN THE OFFICE OF THE CITY CLERK:

Report on the 47th Examination of the City of Tacoma, filed by the Division of Municipal Corporations.

Attorney Allan Overland of 115 North Tacoma Avenue appeared before ouncil to protest the proposed location of an airport in the Gig Harbor area and 466 advised he had petitions signed by approximately/1,000 persons in the area. He added that the airport would reduce property values and county tax revenues. He said the area suggested is a potential "Mercer Island" and that the airport would destroy it as a residential area. There are other sites equally desirable for an arport, he added, which do not entail the loss of good residential and tax areas. Mir. Overland said he understood that Puyallup was quite willing to have the airport to ated in their area.
