route with the storm sewer, which will increase the cost an additional \$50,000.00.

It was moved by Dr. Humiston, seconded by Mr. Jensen that Article IV, Section 13- be amended by deleting the portion of the paragraph after the word "shall" in the second sentence and in lieu thereof adding the following words "be compensated for in accordance with the provisions of Ordinance No. 15106, as amended." and that Section 2, paragraph 5./by changing the rates of Hechanical Storekeeper I to read "1.725-1.811-1.897-1.983-2.069-2.184". Amending Sections 18, 19, 20, 21, 31, 34 and 39 of Ordinance No. 15106, as amended, entitled: "An ordinance adopting the pay or compensation plan as contemplated by Section 6.9 of the City Charter; prescribing the salaries to be paid to nonelective officers and employees of the City, etc." (Department of Public Utilities).

Read by title. Dr. Humiston stated that this ordinance and Ordinance No. 15592 are the result of the recommendations made by McKinesy and Co. He has been informed that some Council Members desire to read the report beforeacting on these ordinances, he said, and the survey company representative has advised him that they plan to furnish the final report on the management part of the survey for next Monday's agenda. 379 As there is no particular reason why this ordinance has to be passed at tonight's meeting, it was moved by Dr. Humiston to lay ordinance #15591 over to April 30th. Motion seconded by Mr. Stojack and carried on roll call: Ayes 8; Nays 0; Absent 1; Hooker.

Ordinance No. 15592.

Amending Ordinance No. 14887, entitled: "An ordinance to be known as the Administrative Code providing for the establishment of a complete plan of administrative organization of the government of the City of Tacoma, etc." by amending Sections 16, 23, 30, 31, 32, 34, 35, 37, 39, 40, 41, 41A and 41C thereof and by adding thereto two new sections to be known as 35A and 35B. (pertaining to the Utilities Department). Read by title. Dr. Humiston advised that the same statements that 380 were made relative to Ordinance No. 15591 hold true for Ordinance No. 15592, and therefore he moved that Ordinance No. 15592 be laid over to April 30th. Hotion seconded by Mr. Perdue and carried on roll call: Ayes 8; Nays 0; Absent 1; Hooker.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

This being the date set by the City Council for hearing on petition of David Doud, et al. (3-19-56) for replat of Lots 7, 8, 9, 11, 12, 13, 14 and 21, Block M, Edw. P. Miller's Country Club Estates First Addition, the Clerk reported that the City Planning Commission has advised that at its meeting of March 20th it acted to recommend that the petition be approved and the replat be accepted. Mr. Buehler, Chief of the Planning Division, stated that the petiton represents 100% of the property owners. Mayor Tollefson asked if any one present was opposed to the replat and no one responded. As the plat had been accepted by Resolution No. 14601 earlier in the meeting, and as there were no remonstrances against the plat, it was deemed that no further action by the Council was necessary at this time.

This being the date set by the Council for hearing on petition of Edw. P.

Miller (3-19-56) for replat of Lots 1 to 7 and 25 to 48, Block 4, and Lots 14 to 46, 336

Block 5, Dakin & Smith's First Addition, the Clerk reported that the City Planning
Commission has advised that at its meeting of April 3, 1956 it recommended that the
petition be approved and that the above replat will become a part of a new plat
which Mr. Miller presently has before the Planning Commission for approval. No
one being present to protest the replat, it was moved by Mr. Perdue, seconded by
Mr. Stojack that the replat be approved. Motion carried on roll call: Ayes 8; Nays
0; Absent 1; Hooker.

NEW BUSINESS:

Mayor Tollefson read a letter from the Portland Avenue Boosters, signed by John J. Sotak, President, stating that due to the fact that East 28th Street from Bay Street to Portland Avenue is used as a highway, they feel the City should maintain this street. Mr. Sotak, who was present, said that during the thawing weather East 28th Street was the only street left open to traffic by the City and as a result it is now in very bad condition. As it is being used as a transport route, he contended it was the duty of the City of Tacoma of the State of Washington, rather than the property owners, to keep it in repair. He also asked that the new road where the City Pipe Line was installed be kept open and maintained as a street,

since this would be a good route for school children to use in reaching the Roosevelt School. After further discussion, Mayor Tollefson referred the letter to the City Manager to take up with the Director of Public Works in order to ascertain what can be done to improve both streets.

Mr. Stojack asked, for a point of information, whether or not it was legal for a Department Head to come directly to the City Council with a matter instead of presenting it to the City Manager first. Both City Attorney McCormick and City Manager Boyle in turn said that in their opinion this procedure was legal as there are no provisions wither in the City Charter or Administrative code against it.

Dr. Humiston, Chairman of the Transportation Committee, briefly told the Council about a tentative agreement which has been worked out with the Tacoma Transit Co. and is now ready to be presented to the Council. This agreement provides for the Company to lease all its physical assets to the City and the City in turn would hire the Company to operate the system. An agreement of this sort would give the Transit Co. some of the "breaks" enjoyed by municipally owned systems and still not put the City in the transit business, he added. Dr. Humiston asked that an ordinance covering this agreement be prepared by the Legal Department for Council's action.

Hr. Bratrud, Chairman of the County-City Building Committee, reported that the County Commissioners are still evaluating their program, However he should have some report to submit to Council by next Monday, he added.

Dr. Battin advised Council that he was going to be in a number of Eastern cities in the next week or ten days at his own expense. He would like the approval of the Council to talk with certain men who might be interested in the City Manager position in Tacoma, he added. Mayor Tollefson approved this idea, saying such interviews would be of great assistance to the Council. In this connection, the Mayor urged all Council members to review the applications on file as soon as possible, with a view to eliminating all those who are not qualified, so the Council can fill the position with the least possible delay.

Upon motion, duly seconded and carried, Council then adjourned at
