Mr. Barline, Utilities Director, said this Resolution extends the time of completion of the project. The original license was issued with the requirement that the project be completed two years after commencement. Immediately after receiving the approval of the United States Supreme Court, the Utilities Department filed an extension to the license to extend the completion date. The Federal Power Commission granted this

with the condition that construction resume by July 1, 1959 and the project completed by July 1, 1962. Under the terms of the extension it becomes final after thirty days and must be accepted by the City within sixty days from the date of its issuance which was January 19, 1959.

Mr. Anderson asked if construction could be resumed by July 1, 1959 since this involved calling for bids again and the selling of bonds, etc.

Mr. Barline explained that they had not planned on doing that, but as an example: high water caused damage last year and there is repair work that must be done which will be considered construction work. He felt they can get under construction by July 1 without selling bonds or having the major contracts awarded.

Mr. Rowlands said this Ordinance will bring the City's code up to date. This one of the requirements of the Workable Program which the Federal Government requires the City to prepare prior to final commitments in the capital grants.

Mr. C. F. Straw, a plumber, requested the Council to postpone action on this rdinance for sixty days until after the Western Plumbing Officials Convention or if action was taken at this time that the Council consider suggested amendments. He explained they were attempting to make it possible so that a journeyman can work under the same code in various cities, thus eliminating the necessity of taking several examinations.

Mr. Davis, Chairman of the Citizens Advisory Committee on the Plumbing Code said the Citizens Committee recognizes that the Uniform Plumbing Code of 1958 is a asic code used in the Western States and feel that this Ordinance follows that Uniform Cole as closely as possible. Each City has individual problems which call for amend-

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ments to this Uniform Code. He said he cannot see why a postponement of sixty days would be advantageous as a modern code is needed and amendments can always be made at a later date.

Mr. Murphy, City Plumbing Inspector, said as far as they can see the propos code is a good one.

Mr. Gillis, City Building Inspector, agreed with Mr. Davis that a postponement of sixty days would be to no advantage.

Report on status of Tacoma's Urban Renewal Program.

Mr. Rowlands said he would like to bring the Council up to date on the rhan Renewal Program. He said there will have to be an appraisal of the Center Street and in regards to Urban Renewal. There are two types of appraisals involved; one lich will be made by certified appraisers, also a market analysis, a re-use study, a necessary by consultants who are experts in this field.

Mr. Robert Jacobson, Urban Renewal Co-ordinator, reported on the progress studies being made in the Center Street Urban Renewal project which has received reliminary approval from the Federal Government. He said the City is arranging with laster Appraisers Organization in Tacoma to have the required appraisals made of reperties in the Center project area. He said Council's approval will also be sought ortly on the retention of a firm to make a market analysis in connection with the last re-use to be specified for the area, who are experts in this field.

Mr. Blangy, a member of the appraisers' group, said a meeting was held with the local members of the American Institute of Real Estate Appraisers, at which time program necessary to qualify for the Federal program was discussed. He said the mup will be able to estimate the cost of the appraisals after it receives the final list of properties included in the project.

Mr. Rowlands explained that two sets of two appraisals each are required on each piece of property - one for acquisition purposes and one for disposition purposes. Said this information will be given to the Council in more detail next week.

NEINISHED BUSINESS: 71.0-251

Progress report on Parking Program.

Mr. Rowlands said that the downtown property owners and merchants are hopeful obtaining firm commitments on the financing for two downtown parking garages within the next week or two. One major insurance company is definitely interested in financing first mortgage on the garages.

The garages, to accommodate some 600 cars, will be built on the extension of 10th and 12th Streets between Pacific and Commerce, with ramps to Broadway. The city has ond funds set aside to build escalators from Pacific to Broadway adjacent to the garages.

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Dr. Humiston said he received an anonymous letter complaining of the procedure of the Civil Service examinations and he would like the Manager to investigate this matter and report his findings.

Dr. Humiston asked what had resulted from the Council's motion made at the Council meeting on February 2 requesting that the Fife Council be invited to discuss annexation with a committee appointed from the Tacoma City Council.

Mayor Hanson said he had an engagement with Mayor Vraves Tuesday afternoon to discuss such a meeting of the two Councils.

Mr. Bratrud brought up that he thinks the City ordinance which permiss minors to drink with parental consent ought to be changed. He said an eighteen year oboy had been acquitted of drinking charges last week when his lawyer produced an affidavit from the boy's father stating the youth had his permission to drink. Mr. Bratrud suggested than an amendment be brought in for the Council's action next week changing the Ordinance whereby not permitting minors to have liquor in their possessic regardless of parental consent.

Mr. Easterday brought up that Resolution No. 15642 awarding contract to Wested Tire Company for furnishing annual supply of passenger tires for 1959 and to Evergreen Company for truck tires and passenger and truck tubes, be brought back to th Council for their reconsideration so that the Wested Tire Company can be given an equa opportunity to be heard as the Evergreen Company had at the time of the passage of the Resolution which was on Monday February 9, 1959.

Mr. Easterday then moved that this Resolution No. 15642 be reconsidered at the meeting of February 24, 1959. Seconded by Mr. Bratrud. Roll call: Ayes 9; Nays 0; Absent 0.

Mr. Porter said he was contemplating asking the City Attorney's office to draw up an Ordinance endorsing a bill introduced by Representatives A. L. Rasmussen and A. B. Comfort pertaining to the World's Fair which proposes enlarging the Commissi from eight to ten, including a member from Spokane and Tacoma. The bill also proposes setting over the opening date until 1965 when possibly; the second Lake Washington Bridge and most of the Seattle freeway will be completed, thus providing better traffif facilities. Also by 1965 he thought more countries will be able to participate in the Fair, making it a World's Fair rather than an Exposition with only Russia and the United States participating.

Mr. Rowlands passed out the Legislative bulletin for the week. He reported that eight bills introduced by Tacoma had the support of the Central Labor Council. Seven of the bills had the support of the Chamber of Commerce. He reminded the Counci of the very important march on Olympia by the Cities of the State Wednesday, February 17, 1959.

Mr. Rowlands said as far as Coast League baseball is concerned, Sacramento has acquired the franchise so Tacoma can forget about this for now.

Mr. Anderson said he felt that if Tacoma entered into negotiations earlier next year they might have a better chance of obtaining such a franchise.

Hr. Rowlands said in reference to having coast league baseball in Tacoma, it might be well to have the Planning Commission study the best site for a ball park

· ! he would like the Council's direction on this. Council agreed this would be a ed suggestion.

Mr. Rowlands said for the Council's information bids are reopened on Salvage erator for the City as the person previously awarded the contract elected not to go rough with it. The bids will be opened March 2, 1959.

Mr. Rowlands asked Mr. Bratrud to bring the Council up to date on the bids ceived for the job of moving city and county offices into the new building.

Mr. Bratrud said the approximate costs had been received from seven local irms. The building committee members feel that Pacific Storage Company should get Court House moving, Smyth Company the Public Safety Building and Bekins Moving impany the City Hall; Mayflower Moving the Health Department. He said the Council approve the acceptance of the hiring of the companies for the City Hall and the combined move.

Mr. Bratrud then moved that the contract for moving the equipment of the ity Hall be awarded to Bekins Company; the moving of the equipment of the Public Safety wilding be awarded to Smyth and Company; the moving of the equipment of the Health partment be awarded to Mayflower Moving, and the combined move be awarded to the levest bidder. Seconded by Mr. Perdue. Roll call: Ayes 9; Nays 0; Absent 0.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, upon motion duly made and seconded, the meeting was adjourned at 6:20 P.M.
