CITY COUNCIL MINUTES

City Council Chambers Tuesday, July 18, 1969

A special meeting of the Council was called to order by Mayor Rasmussen at 2 P.M.

Present on roll call 5: Barfield, Fott, Cvitanich, Zatkovich and Mayor Fasmuseen. Absent 4: Hermann, Johnson, Finnigan and Murtland.

Mayor Resmussen announced that this special meeting was called to take up the resolution declaring Monday July 21, 1969 a legal holiday. President Nixon and Governor Evans have heretofore proclaimed it a national and state day of participation in honor of man's first effort to land on the moon, and for the further purpose of considering other business as may be brought forward by any member of the Council.

Resolution No. 20316

Declaring Monday, July 21, 1969 a legal holiday in honor of men's first effort to land on the moon.

Moved by Mr. Cvitanich that the resolution be adopted. Seconded by Mr. Zatkovich. Voice vote was taken on the resolution, resulting as follows.

Ayes 5: Banfield, Bott, Cvitanich, Zatkovich and Mayor Rasmussen.

Nays 0: Absent 4: Finnigan, Herrmann, Johnson and Murtland.

The Resolution was declared passed by the Chairman.

Mr. Cvitanich explained at the AWC convention in Seattle it has been reported that Congress is discussing the idea of taxing income on Municipal Bonds.

Mr. Cvitanich moved that a telegram be sent to the Washington State congressmen in Washington, D.C., notifying them the Tacoma City Council is in opposition to tax income on Municipal Bonds. Seconded by Mrs. Banfield.

Mayor Rasmussen thought, perhaps this telegram would be a bit premature as Congress is discussing at the present time a revision of the tax laws.

After some discussion, Mr. Cvitanich moved that the motion be amended and the legal staff explore the tax exempt situation and bring this information to the City Council on Tuesday, July 29. Seconded by Mr. Bott. Voice vote taken. Motion carried.

Mr. Bott moved to adjourn the special meeting. Seconded by Mr. Zatkovich. The meeting was adjourned at 2:30 P.M.
