#### Py STOJACK:

Authorizing City Manager to execute the attached agreement with the proper officials of Pierce County Fire District No. 4 for the installation and maintenance of 12 Radio Equipment by the City of Tacoma Fire Department in Pierce County Fire District No. 1 (Midland) fire fighting vehicles. The Clerk read the resolution in full. Mr. Back-strom reported that Fire Chief Fisk had contacted Fire Chief David McPherson of the Midland Fire Department relative to paying \$15.00 per month per installation for three trucks as suggested by Councilman Jensen at the last meeting, and Mr. McPherson had advised that an expense of \$540.00 per year for this service was financially impossible, but he felt that the Board of Commissioners would accept a charge up to \$100.00 per year. The Council discussed the resolution and the offer from the Midland Fire Department, and it

was moved by Mrs. Goering to lay Resolution 13876 over for one week to April 19th to allow time for further study and for rewriting of the agreement if necessary. Seconded by Mr. Perdue and carried on roll call: Ayes 6; Nays 0; Absent 3, Battin, Bratrud, Jensen.

Providing for the making of certain additions, replacements and betterments to the misting municipal water works system of the City of Tacoma; specifying and adopting the lan and system proposed therefor; declaring the estimated cost thereof as near as may be determined; providing for the issuance and sale of Series "A", Series "B", Series "C", Series "D", and Series "E" Special Obligation Bonds of the City of Tacoma in the amount of 11,000,000.00 each, to be known as Water Bonds Series "A" 1954, Water Bonds Series "B" 1954, and Water Bonds Series "B" 1954; and creating and establishing a special fund for the payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds. Amending Sections 11, 15, 19, and 20 of Ordinance No. 14967 entitled: "An ordinance relating to and establishing the positions of the various departments of the City government; fixing the compensation to be paid the officers and employes of said departments; etc. (1954 Salary Ordinance)" repealing Sections 1, 2, 3 and 4 of Ordinance No. 14977; and declaring an emergency making necessary the immediate passage of this ordinance and its taking effect immediately after publication. Read by title. Itwas moved by Col. Hooker, seconded by Dr. Humiston to suspend Rule 9. Carried unanimously on voice vote. The ordinance was then passed without having been read in full.

Mr. Backstrom informed the Council that he has received several letters are the Goodwill Industries, asking that they be exempted from paying fees amounting \$1.00 per load for dumping privileges at the Tacoma City Garbage Dump. The Goodwill relustries have advised him that they ordinarily have one truck load a day for the dump, as they are a charitable institution, they feel they should not have to pay a charge redumping privileges. Mr. Backstrom explained that if the Goodwill Industries were dempted from this payment, the City would necessarily have to grant the same concession other charitable organizations such as the Salvation Army, Volunteers of America, are Rescue Mission and many others, which would mean a loss in revenue of approximate \$1500 year and would be serious to the Department's finances. After a discussion the Council, it was decided to have Mr. Backstrom write a letter to the Goodwill in the situation and notifying them that it will not be possible exempt their organization from the payment of this fee.

## INFINISHED BUSINESS:

Mr. Backstrom reported back on Judge W. A. Richmond's proposal (3-22-54) reimburse the City for the purchase of the vacant property at the foot of North the Street and Stadium Way in return for an easement giving him the right of ingress and egress over this tract of land, and advised that the tract in question is 55' and that the Light Department is going to remove its substation from the 25' admining this property, but intends to retain the site in order to service any future newer needs on the Waterfront in this area. The matter was discussed at length, and it was the consensus of the Council that it would be for the best interest of the City if the lots were sold to private individuals, and that the City should not enter into the transaction with Judge Richmond.

Upon motion, duly seconded and carried, Council then adjourned at 9:30 P.M.
