FINAL READING OF ORDINANCES:

Authorizing and directing a loan in an amount not exceeding \$244,000 from the City of Tacoma to the Metropolitan Park District of Tacoma, a municipal corporation, in order to provide for the continued maintenance and operation of the District's Parks and other recreational activities and facilities within the City; declaring an emergency requiring the extension of such financial aid; and authorizing the execution and delivery of a contract between the City and the Metropolitan Park District of Tacoma, setting forth the terms and conditions under which said loan shall be made and repaid. Read by title; It was moved by Dr. Humiston, seconded by Mr. Bratrud to suspend rule 9 and carried unanimously on voice vote. The ordinance was then passed without having been read in full.

Ordinance No. 15029. (laid over to this date on July 12th).

Amending Ordinance No. 11701 (Traffic Code) entitled: "An ordinance regulating travel and traffic on the streets of the City of Tacoma; providing a penalty for the violation thereof, etc." by adding thereto a section to be known as Section 109-18. (Restricted parking district North E Street between Division Avenue and North 1st). Read by title. It was reported that the letter re loading zones had been received from the owner of the building, but had not been studied by the Traffic Engineer. It was moved by Dr. Humiston, seconded by Dr. Battin that the ordinance be laid over until July 26th and carried unanimously on voice vote.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

The program on Mehtal Health in Vocational Rehabilitation, presented by Dr. C. R. Fargher, Director of Health, at Council meeting of July 6th and tabled until this date by motion of Council on July 12th, was brought up at this time. It was referred to the Finance Committee for study and recommendation and report back on August 2nd.

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The City Clerk read a communication from G. M. Morris, Acting Field Representative of the Public Administration Service, submitting the report on the review of the Classification Plan and Recommended Compensation Plan for the City of Tacoma for Council's action. Mayor Tollefson stated that he thought a special meeting of the Council should be held to discuss this report and the proposed bond issue program, and asked Council's wishes on the matter. All the Council members agreed to this special receting, and after a discussion, it was moved by Dr. Humiston, seconded by Dr. Battin to hold a meeting at 8:00 P. M. Wednesday evening to discuss the Public Administration Service Report, and the proposed bond issue program; and to invite members of the Planning Commission and Mr. Tomsho of the Public Administration Service staff to be present at this meeting. Motion carried on roll call: Ayes 8; Nays 0; Absent 1; Perdue.

Mr. Charles E. Morton, President of the Civil Service Board, presented the roposed revisions of the Personnel Rules with the recommendations and comments of the Civil Service Board, for Council's action and approval. Mr. D. H. Ketler,

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siness Representative of the Civil Service League, stated that they as employes were ready accept the rules as approved by the Civil Service Board. The Council did not discuss the proposed revisions of the Personnel Rules at this time, and it was moved by Dr. Humiston, seconded by Dr. Battin, that the proposed rules be discussed at the next Council meeting (7-26-54) at which time any City employee who wishes, may be present to ask questions or discuss any point of the proposed rules. Both Mr. Jensen and Mr. Stojack objected to the holding of a meeting with employes, as they felt nothing could be accomplished since the employes through their business representative have given approval to the Rules as revised by the Civil Service Board. The location of the meeting and probable attendance was discussed and at the conclusion Mayor Tollefson announced that the July 26th meeting of the Council would be held in the auditorium of the Public tilities Building.

NEW BUSINESS:

Mr. Backstrom, City Manager, reported that he had received a request from Mr. Staman, Director of Public Works, to schedule extra L. I. D. Committee meetings on ugust 17th and 31st for the purpose of holding several hearings on Public Works deartment improvements. Mr. Backstrom asked the permission of the L. I. D. Committee rembers to hold these meetings, and Mr. Jensen, Dr. Humiston and Mayor Tollefson all assented to this and instructed the Director of Public Works to proceed with the hearings on the above dates.

Upon motion, duly seconded and carried, Council recessed at 9:30 P. M. to reconvene at 8 P. M. Wednesday, July 21st in the Council room.
