Mr. E. K. Murray, Attorney, was spokesman for a group opposing the Charter amendments pertaining to the Public Utilities Board. He said the proposed amendment was based on a misconception of the Council's duties in regard to the Utilities as outlined by the Charter. The Utilities Board is an administrative body, whereas the Council is supposed to confine their duties to legislative matters, he added. He suggested if any changes are made, it be in the direction of creating a higher degree of independence for the Board. He said he would more than likely be in favor of going along the lines of Resolution No. 15194, to be presented tonight, which provides for the direct election of the Board, and is sponsored by In. Stojack.

Mr. Clif Erdahl, Director of the Pacific Northwest Utilites Conference Committee, concurred in Mr. Murray's remarks.

Mr. Geo. Gentes, Manager of Hooker Electrochemical Co., said he felt the present "tility Board set-up is in "the best interest of preserving the Utilities" stability of operations".

Mr. D. E. Newhouse, Legislative Chairman of the Pierce County Central Labor Council, said he feard that if the Utility Board is eliminated the situation will lead itself concernit the use of utilities to collect the City's taxes.

Mr. Walter Gordon, R. L. Clevenger, Carl Staff, Gerrit Vander Ende, Tom Anderson, the latter two being former members of the Utility Board, and several others spoke against the amendments.

Mr. Tollefson, sponsor of the Resolution, said he thought the speakers were losing sight of the fact that Utility revenues are protected by State Law as well as by the Charter. He said the Council has had difficulty getting necessary information on Utilities' operations under the present arrangement and said the consolidation would mean a "tremendous savings" in the cost of Municipal Government.

Mr. Bratrud said the City's "part time" Council has enough of a burdern supervisin the functions of the General Government and that the Councilmen wouldn't have enough time to do a good job on the Utilities unlessthey were made full time. D

Dr. Battin spoke in favor of the amendment. He said the majority of the 1952 Presholders who draw up the Charter had been in favor of a combined operation but had been that by a few freeholders that they would campaign against the Charter, which they did anyway, he added.

Mr. McCormick advised that they would have to be redrawn to give the people a nice between them.

Dr. Humiston said he was in favor of the change, but would vote against placing to on the March ballot.

Mr. Perdue agreed that the change would be desirable but the timing was bad.

Dr. Battin said the Council should assure the members of the Utility Board it
has full confidence in their intelligence, integrity and intentions and have merely been discussin the form of Government.

Mayor Antierson said he would send a letter to the Board members to that effect.
