Authorizing execution and delivery of an agreement between the City of Tacoma and the County of Pierce, providing for location, ownership, occupancy and maintenance and operation of the County-City Building, together with all parking lots and facilities in connection therewith; and setting forth and defining therein the rights and duties of the parties and the terms and conditions in respect thereto; and repealing Ordinance No. 15393, passed August 1, 1955. Read by title. City Manager Rowlands suggested that in order not to confuse the issues, it might be better to pass Ordinance No. 15662 before discussing the alternates, which have been presented in M. C. 86. Dr. Humiston agreed with Mr. Rowlands, saying he would like to see the Council pass this ordinance in order to clear the way, so the County Commissioners can proceed. Roll was then called on the passage of the ordinance, resulting as follows:

Vacating Hegra Road between Aurora Avenue and Fernside Drive, and that portion of Aurora Avenue lying north of the north line of Hegra Road produced westerly; and retaining and reserving an easement therein for the construction, repair and maitenance of public utilities and services. Read by title. Mr. Rowlands stated that several changes are being considered, he has sent for information from ordinances of other cities, which has not been received as yet, and for this reason would like to have the ordinance, under consideration by the Council, postponed for one more week, he added. It was moved by Dr. Humiston, seconded by Mr. Stojack to postpone Ordinance No. 15630 for one week to July 30, 1956. Carried on roll call: Ayes 7; Nays 1; Battin; Absent 1; Perdue.

#### UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

the improvement in L I D 1950- sanitary severs in vicinity of South 64th and Sheridan. It was moved by Mr. Tollefson, seconded by Dr. Humiston that August 21, 1956 be fixed as the date for hearing on the above assessment roll. Motion carried on roll call: Ayes 8; mays 0; Absent 1; Perdue.

M. C. 86- relative to recommendations on the County-City Building, copies of which had been furnished each Council-member, was brought up for consideration at this time. Recommendation #1 in the Summary was discussed. This recommendation was that the City participate in a financial program to include Alternate E (rough frame 5 and 6 floors) in the letting of the contract early next month, preferably with the County participating on the same basis as the original formula, but if for some reason

that is not feasible, the City should still participate to the extent of 50% of the cost of roughing in these floors. Mr. Rowlands stated that he had discussed this with Mr. Garlington and County Commissioner Burke, who was the only one in town last week, They intimated the County would participate on the basis of the original formula, but they would appreciate it if the City went in on a 50-50 basis. Mayor Anderson said in his opinion Mr. Rowlands should talk to all three County Commissioners and u5# report back at the next meeting. It was pointed out that the dead-line for accepting Alternate E is August 10th, which allowed ample time to make the final decision on this matter next Monday. Mr. Rowlands advised the Council that September 1st is the dead-line for putting a bond proposition on the ballot and after the question of "Alternates" has been decided, consideration can be given to the bond issue problem. Dr. Battin said he had hoped the money in the City Hall Building Fund might be spent for furniture and equipment in the new building and asked if this would be possible. City Attorney McCormick replied that legally this money could only be used for building purposes or permanent repairs. Decision was held in abeyance until next Monday night.

Mayor Anderson brought to Council's attention the "Register and Vote"

Campaign, which is being conducted this week with Cal Winslow from Organized Labor 462 handling the publicity.

Mr. Rowlands read a letter which his office had received from Al Lindstrom, stating that if Tacoma's storm sewer is turned into Leach Creek, his property will be damaged approximately \$30,000 and he would be forced to sue the City for this amount. The problem was discussed and Mr. Staman said he felt a great deal of misunderstanding and concern is due to the fact that the public believes this is to be a sanitary sewer rather than a storm sewer. Mr. Rowlands stated that he is meeting tomorrow morning with Fircrest officials and he hopes to have a complete report for Council next Mcnday.

Mr. Rowlands also advised a report on the 6th Avenue Dock and Ferry landing  $\mu_{2,q}$  proposal would be presented next week.

Dr. Humiston reported briefly on the hearing on July 17th before the County Commissioners on the Fife Incorporation petition. The City of Tacoma presented its information and it soon appeared that the biggest issue was the water supply. Mr. Baarslag and Mr. Benedetti of the Water Department presented the facts very well, Dr. Humiston said. The proponents in their presentation maintained such a Corporation could exist and that they could make a success of it, he added. Mayor Anderson said some of the property owners have expressed a desire to meet with the Council to 475 see if their problems can be worked out and he had advised them the Council is willing to meet with them whenever they wish. Dr. Battin said it was his impression at the hearing that the proponents are depending on the City of Tacoma to take care of such important things as water, power and roads.

Upon motion, duly seconded and carried, Council adjourned at 8:30 P. M.
