### **REPORTS BY CITY MANAGER**

City Manager Ray E. Corpuz Jr. reminded everyone that this weekend the 24-hour Relay for Life event will be held. He stated that this event is one of the largest fund raising events for cancer research. He stated that the City of Tacoma has five teams participating in the event. Mr. Corpuz then acknowledged Sue Evans, Hearing Examiner's Office, and Pat Flynn, Community Relations Office, who helped organize the event.

### COMMENTS AND COMMITTEE REPORTS OF CITY COUNCIL

Council Member Phelps requested additional information regarding the interlocal agreements with various other local cities relative to fleet maintenance and repair services to designated vehicles and equipment. He stated that this issue is scheduled to be considered by the City Council on Tuesday, June 6, 2000. He stated that he would be interested in knowing how the cost associated with the agreements was determined. Council Member Phelps also inquired about whether or not a capital cost is associated with the billing system.

Council Member Phelps then stated that the City Council has received an inquiry from Metricom, a telecommunications company. He stated that the proposed fees being charged for Metricom to install internet wireless service on utility poles in the city limits are 300 percent higher than that of the City of Seattle and the City of Bellevue. He requested an explanation as to why the Department of Public Utilities' cost structure for this service is so high.
