Council Member Stenger stated for the record that there was a typographical error in the title. North "I" Street should read North 1st Street.

Mayor Sutherland stated that this property was adjacent to property he used to own. He stated he no longer had an interest in the property, but would take no action on this matter.

Deputy Mayor Rasmussen moved to concur in the Findings, Conclusions and Recommendations of the Hearings Examiner. Seconded by Council Member Nielsen. Voice vote was taken and carried, with Mayor Sutherland abstaining. The motion was declared adopted.
