## COMMUNICATIONS:

a. Hearings Examiner submitting Shoreline Management Substantial Development Permit No. 141.367 requested by the Port of Tacoma to allow dredging of 35,750 cubic yards to remove a shoal in the navigation channel in Blair Waterway near Terminal Four.

Mayor Sutherland moved to concur in the Findings, Conclusions and Recommendations of the Hearings Examiner. Seconded by Council Member Hyde. Roll call vote was taken, resulting as follows: Ayes: 6 - Bichsel, Hyde, Kirby, Ladenburg, Harnick, and Mayor Sutherland. Nays: 0. Absent: 2 -Rasmussen and Stenger. The motion was declared adopted.

b. Hearings Examiner submitting Shoreline Management Substantial Development Permit No. 141.363 requested by Jay Spearman/Glacier Sand and Gravel Company to allow maintenance dredging of 9,000 cubic yards over five years and to allow the construction of a 240' X 70' concrete wharf at the southeasterly end of Hylebos Waterway (360) Taylor Way).

Amending Chapter 13.06 of the Official Code to reclassify the property located on the west side of Steele Street between South 92nd and South 93rd Streets extended west from an "R-4-LPRD" Planned Residential Development District to a "C-1" Commercial District to construct a two-story office building with a first floor convenience store. Ordinance No. 23487

Amending Chapter 11.23 of the Official Code relating to street closures to remove the requirement for insurance for neighborhood block parties.

The Ordinance was set over for final reading next week.

Council Member Hyde moved that the Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Deputy Mayor Bichsel. Voice vote was taken and carried. The Resolution was declared adopted.

#### Resolution No. 28932

Authorizing the execution of Amendment No. 2 to the agreement with the Tacoma Fireboat Marine Museum Foundation to establish the date of July 31, 1986 as the expiration of the City's \$40,000.00 matching fund commitment.

Council Member Hyde moved that the Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Council Member Kirby. Voice vote was taken and carried. The Resolution was declared adopted.

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### CITIZEN'S REQUEST TO BE HEARD: Began at 5:29 p.m. \*

Chris Williams, Tacoma Unemployed Center, requesting to speak regarding unemployment in Tacoma and the "Hayes Income and Jobs Action Act."

Ms. Chris Williams spoke to the Council regarding this matter. Also speaking to the Council in support of the "Hayes Income and Jobs Action Act" was Chuck O'Donahue, President of the Pierce County Central Labor Council.

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Mayor Sutherland proclaimed the week of October 6-13, 1985, to be "Housing Week," and presented the proclamation to Mr. Russ Dalla, Director of Government Services for the Homebuilders' Association of Greater Tacoma.

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# COMMENTS AND COMMITTEE REPORTS BY MEMBERS OF THE CITY COUNCIL:

Council Member Hyde requested that staff look at potential earthquake problems in the city and the City's possible response and recovery efforts in this situation. He requested that staff work out a detailed plan of action to deal with earthquakes. He specifically requested the information in time for inclusion in the 1986 budget planning process.

Council Member Harnick stated he had received a petition from citizens in the vicinity of North 37th and Stevens who had requested that the gulch be cleaned up from Ruston Way to the North 37th and Stevens area. Council Member Marnick stated that the area was overgrown and was a potential traffic danger.

Council Member Kirby requested that staff look into and correct a problem in the South Tacoma Way business district area. He stated that on one side of South Tacoma Way there was one-hour parking and on the other side of the street was two-hour parking. He said he would like the parking signs to be the same on both sides of the street unless there was a good reason why this should not be so.

Mayor Sutherland stated that on October 14, 1985, at 11:30 a.m., Mr. Kai Lee, a representative from the State of Mashington Power Planning Commission, would speak at a luncheon in the Pavilion board room, and the Mayor invited all Council members to attend.

PUBLIC HEARINGS AND APPEALS: Began at 5:55 p.m.

This is the date set for a public hearing to consider amendments to Chapter 13.06 of the Official Code to allow golf course signage within residential districts and require special use permits for agricultural uses over 20,000 square feet in size.

Mr. Tom Dolan, Planning Department, made a presentation to the Council regarding the proposed amendments.
