#### REPORTS BY CITY MANAGER:

City Manager, Erling Mork, advised he had two claims for Council action and introduced Fran Chapin, Assistant City Attorney, who reported on an accident involving a young boy who was struck by a car after alighting from a Transit bus in the middle of the block, in a crosswalk. He advised that a tentative settlement, equally shared by the auto insurer, has been reached and recommended approval. The City's share if \$2750.

Mayor Johnston moved to concur in the recommendation of the City Attorney. Seconded by Mr. Warnick. Voice vote was taken and carried.



Mr. Chapin also reported on an accident at 6th & Bantz Boulevard, when an auto was struck by a police car on an emergency call. A partial settlement is recommended at this time up to \$3,000.

Mr. Schroeder moved to concur in the recommendation of the Legal Department. Seconded by Mr. Warnick. Voice vote was taken and carried.

### COMMENTS AND COMMITTEE REPORTS BY MEMBERS OF THE CITY COUNCIL:

Mayor Johnston referred to a communication received from Steven Levy, Chairman of the Citizens Revenue Sharing Committee who advises that they may not be able to complete their work by October 13th—the date originally set by Council, and has requested that they have until October 28th to complete their task. Mayor Johnston advised that the Administration has no problem with that. Mayor Johnston said he would so advise Mr. Levy that they have until October 28th to complete their task.

Mr. Strege reported that he had attended a meeting of the Revenue Sharing Committee last Saturday when it was called to his attention that two programs of the Mary Bridge Hospital, presently being funded, were not submitted on time. The applications for the Poison Information Center and the Women and Infants Care Program. He requested that these two applications be forwarded to the Department of Human Development and to the Revenue Sharing Committee for consideration, together with the other Revenue Sharing applications.

Mayor Johnston moved that they be included and submitted to the Committee for evaluation. Seconded by Mr. Warnick. Voice vote was taken and carried.

Mr. Nielsen, Council's Planning Commission member, reported the Commission had their second meeting with the North Slope Citizens Advisory Committee and have developed a questionnaire to be mailed to 1,000 at random residents of the North Slope study area.

Mr. Warnick commented favorably on the programs of the Civic Arts Commission and the new sculpture on the Bank of California Building. He also referred to the Youth in Arts Program and advised that there was a film on this which he felt Council should see.

Mrs. Bichsel reported that Civic Arts will have the New York Ballet performing here in Tacoma on October 17th.

Mr. Sonntag requested a memo from the City Manager's office regarding the possibility of a Winter Pops Concert series in the rotunda of the Bicentennial Pavilion.

Mr. Sonntag also advised the Council members that there will be a legislative committee session this week-end in Olympia and he urged that as many of them as possible attend the session.

Mrs. Bichsel reported that last week she attended an all day session of the Puget Sound Council of Governments where they discussed the Coast Regional Power Plant. Mr. Hudson was Chairman and she felt he did an outstanding job.

Mr. Schroeder asked to be excused from the next two Council meetings as he will be on vacation. Mr. Nielsen moved to excuse Mr. Schroeder for the next two weeks. Seconded by Mr. Sonntag. Voice vote was taken and carried.

On proper motion, the meeting adjourned at 6:45 P.M.
