COMMENTS AND COMMITTEE REPORTS OF CITY COUNCIL

Council Member Miller reported on the efforts of the Association of Washington Cities regarding their Legislative Action priorities which included: mitigating impacts of Initiative 695 and the loss of revenue affecting cities; long-term transportation funding solutions, using a balanced revenue package; developing legislation that allocates funds to cities and counties when criminal penalties are increased, which require additional jail time, or enact new laws that require additional police, court or jail services, which impact city budgets; court reform; domestic violence prevention; electric utility restructuring; telecommunications and public rights-of-way; affordable housing; smart growth investments with state money; Endangered Species Act; authority and zoning relating to gambling activities; unfunded mandates; and economic development issues.

Deputy Mayor Phelps moved to convene to Executive Session to discuss labor negotiations, the session not to exceed 30 minutes. Seconded by Council Member McGavick. Voice vote was taken and carried. The motion was declared adopted.
