Resolution No. 24744 (Continued from the meeting of December 13th)

Providing for the selection of an Alternative as proposed in the Interim Report Alternatives Evaluation November 1977 for Tacoma Industrial Airport, Pierce County Multi-Airport Master Plan.

Ken Reid of Reid, Mittleton and Associates, Inc., displayed plans for the four alternatives and explained the differences in the runways and their alternative uses.

Mr. Schroeder moved to insert on line 13 alternative number 2 and on line 14, alternative number 2. Seconded by Mr. Sonntag. Voice vote was taken and carried.

Citizens speaking were:

- Admiral James S. Russell, representing the Industrial Bureau of the Tacoma Area Chamber of Commerce, who asked that the Council take a look at the long range plans for the benefit of business to the airport and for safety reasons that the runway should be at least 6,000 feet.
- Don Barber, Executive Vice-President of Tacoma Area Chamber of Commerce, who also asked that the plans include a longer runway.
- James Morton, Attorney representing RATIA (Responsible Airport Planning for Tacoma Industrial Airport), spoke in favor of alternative number two.
- Dr. James Billingsley, President of Air Gemini at the Tacoma Industrial Airport, explained the trend of business at the airport as moving more toward corporate air craft which some have a need for longer runways for full loads.

Mr. Hudson moved to amend the Resolution by adding another Whereas after line 11 to read as follows: "Whereas, the City of Tacoma finds that the best available data does not, at this time, justify any alternative providing for a lengthening of the runway but instead suggests such a decision should be postponed until 1996;" he also asked that the following be added on line 15 after the word Tacoma, "for possible implementation before 1996," and he asked that on line 17 the words be changed to read: "Alternative for this 20 year development of the Tacoma Industrial Airport." Seconded by Mr. Warnick. Voice vote was taken and declared failed.

Mr. Schroeder moved to amend the resolution on line 17 after the word alternative, add the word plan and after the final sentence of the resolution add the following: "The said plan to be updated on a five year basis." Seconded by Mr. Sonntag. Voice vote was taken and carried.

Mr. Hudson moved to continue the Resolution for one week. Seconded by Mr. Nelson.

Roll call vote was taken as follows: Ayes: 3 - Hudson, Nelson and Mayor Johnston. Nays: 6 - Bichsel, Nielsen, Schroeder, Sonntag, Strege and Warnick. The motion was declared failed.

Designating the Comprehensive Planning Assistance Program as a Major Federal Aid Project pursuant to Section 1.24.980 of the Official Code.

Mrs. Bichsel moved that the Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Mr. Schroeder. Voice vote was taken and carried. The Resolution was declared adopted.

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Resolution No. 24762

Expressing the City Council's intent to make retroactive salary adjustments for those classes not in formal bargaining units.

Mr. Nielsen moved that the Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Mrs. Bichsel. Voice vote was taken and carried. The Resolution was declared adopted.

Resolution No. 24763

Authorizing the purchase of A.M. demonstrator equipment and waiving competitive bidding requirements.

Mrs. Bichsel moved that the Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Mr. Warnick. Voice vote was taken and carried. The Resolution was declared adopted.

Resolution No. 24764

Authorizing cancellation of agreement with Alvin G. and Margarita Hart for sale of certain LIGF surplus property and refund of down payment.

Mrs. Bichsel moved to amend the Resolution to refund the sum of \$250.00 to Alvin G. and Margarita Hart instead of the \$200.00 as provided for in the Resolution, and also to delete lines 22 and 23. Seconded by Mr. Strege. Voice vote was taken and carried.

Voice vote was taken on the Resolution as amended and carried. The Resolution as amended was declared adopted.

COMMENTS AND COMMITTEE REPORTS BY MEMBERS OF THE CITY COUNCIL:

Mayor Johnston advised that new L.I.D. Committee appointments are due for January, February and March. He asked that the present committee stay on until the new Council members take office, when appointments will be made. Mayor Johnston wished the staff and citizens of Tacoma a Happy and Blessed Holidays.

Mr. Sonntag referred to Revenue Sharing Allocations which had been before Council a few weeks ago. He said ne learned that in the meantime certain changes have been made by staff, resulting in anxious phone calls by citizens. He distributed to Council members substitute Attachment A to Resolution 24720 which he said would be a guide in the preparation of contracts scheduled for next weeks agenda. Mr. Sonntag moved that the Council provide the list to the Assistant Manager for guidance in preparing resolutions for the agenda of December 27, 1977. Seconded by Mr. Strege Voice vote was taken and carried.

Mr. Hudson advised that the Council of Governments created a task force to identify issues to bring to the attention of the Governor, the Congressional Delegation and the Legislature. He submitted a questionnaire of the Executive Board to the City Manager for response by the staff and the Council members. City Manager, Erling Mork, advised he would do this and schedule a time to review the issues with Council before the beginning of the State Legislative Session.

Mr. Hudson commented on a consultant study underway dealing with Federal Way. One of the alternatives mentioned is annexation to the City of Tacoma. He suggested the consultants be invited to make a presentation at a Study Session.

Mr. Warnick gave recognization to the fact that for the first time in history a student at a Tacoma educational institution has been selected to be a Rhodes Scholar, which is a great honor to the City of Tacoma. The student is Roald Severtson of the University of Puget Sound.

Mayor Johnston moved that Council recess into Executive Session to discuss two items of litigation. Seconded by Mr. Sonntag. Voice vote was taken and carried. Council recessed into Executive Session at 8:42 P.M. The Council reconvened at 8:47 P.M.

Mr. Sonntag moved that the Council approve settlements in the Flett Creek cases and Atwood case as disclosed in Executive Session at the recommendation of the City Manager and the City Attorneys. Seconded by Mr. Warnick. Voice vote was taken and carried.
