Erling O. Mork, City Manager, requested an Executive Session for purposes of litigation.

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COMMENTS AND COMMITTEE REPORTS BY MEMBERS OF THE CITY COUNCIL:

Council Member Hyde stated that the entrance to Schuster Parkway in the downtown area was very shabby looking and requested that staff look into this matter.

Council Member Hyde stated that the EPA had placed the deep water section of Commencement Bay on their list of problem areas. He indicated that, during negotiations on the list, the Health Department, the Tacoma-Pierce County Health Board, and the City Council informally agreed to remove the deep water section pending further information from the EPA on the plans for off-shore work. Council Member Hyde stated that the City should draft a letter to the EPA reminding them of their commitment to this problem. Additionally, the City should receive from the EPA either their assurance that the deep water section is not a problem area or an assurance that they will begin gathering information about the problem.

Council Member Warnick expressed concerns about the downtown hillside area, especially in matters concerning rezones. He requested a Study Session on this matter.

Mayor Sutherland moved to recess to Executive Session to discuss litigation. Seconded by Council Member Ladenburg. Voice vote was taken and carried. The motion was declared adopted.

Council recessed to Executive Session at 8:05 p.m. and reconvened at 8:18 p.m.
