PUBLIC HEARINGS:

This is the date set for public hearing on the Six-Year Comprehensive Street Program for the years 1981 through 1986.

Bill Larkin of the Public Works Department reviewed the Six-Year Program for Councilmembers and answered questions.

Citizens speaking at the public hearing were Gus Carlson, 8802 So. Ainsworth and Dick Fyquist, 215 South "G" Street. With no other members of the public coming forward to speak, Deputy Mayor Nielsen declared

COMMENTS AND COMMITTEE REPORTS BY MEMBERS OF THE CITY COUNCIL:

Councilman Rasmussen asked that the City Manager prepare a letter, for concurrence by the City Council regarding the treasure found underneath the stucco on the backside of the old Rhodes Building, urging the law school to preserve the portion of the facade they found that was designed and built in 1890. It is a brick facade with columns of stone. He said he felt it would be appropriate that it be preserved.

Councilman Strege commented on the request of last Spring made by a group of employees from the then Sound Health, and the now Group Health, who approached him regarding a proposed signalization or a crosswalk across 11th Street where their parking lot is located. He said they have now contacted him again seeking a solution to their problem. He also advised that he has been informed there has been another accident at that location where the employees and patients cross 11th Street to the parking lot. He asked that the City Manager and Public Works Department investigate the situation and come up with a solution that would make it convenient for people crossing the street.

Councilman Sutherland referred to the minutes of the Public Utility Board Meeting of May 14, 1980 which indicated that there had been a drastic reduction in the Belt Line activities for log haulings as the result of the Milwaukee Road closure: The report also showed that the Water Division commercial and industrial account indicated a significant decline in consumption. He asked that he be advised as to the seriousness of this situation and whether this is something the City Council should be looking at.
