Council Member Miller declared his affiliation with Mr. Mark Anderson, Municipal Authority President, who assisted him on his campaign; however, he has received no personal remuneration from Mr. Anderson, and would be voting on this project.

Council Member Miller moved to amend the amount listed in Item No. 3 of the memo to Ray Corpuz, City Manager, dated December 2, 1991, of \$1.1 million to \$1.8 million in order to allow an 80 percent loan to value ratio. Seconded by Council Member Evans. Voice vote was taken and carried. The motion was declared adopted. Council Member Miller indicated that the amendment should be reflected in the terms and conditions for this project.

Mayor Vialle announced that Ms. Sandy Burgess of the Tacoma Rescue Mission and Ms. Kathy Bannon of Project Safe Place will be interviewed on "Cityline" by Bill Ogden on Wednesday, December 4, 1991 at 6:30 p.m. on the Municipal TV Channel.

Council Member Warnick announced that the PLU Women's Soccer Team won the national championship.

Council Member Warnick gave tribute to a former City Manager, Mr. Donaldson, who past away this last weekend. Mr. Donaldson served as City Manager when Council Member Warnick first took office.

Mayor Vialle indicated that she attended a briefing at Ft. Lewis concerning the impact our community will have when the 9,600 individuals are transferred to Ft. Lewis from Fort Ord, California. Mayor Vialle requested staff to work with Ft. Lewis staff on planning the impacts the transfer will have on such matters as housing and education.

Mayor Vialle moved to recess to Executive Session to discuss labor negotiations, the session not to exceed 20 minutes. Seconded by Deputy Mayor Mykland. Voice vote was taken and carried. The motion was declared adopted.

Council recessed to Executive Session at 7:40 p.m. and reconvened at 8:00 p.m.
