Amending Chapter 1.30 of the Municipal Code relative to the Tacoma Employes' Retirement System to define employees and public agencies; to exclude insurable interest, Pro-Tem positions and Library personnel who are temporary and/or substitutes; to include special project employees; to provide language for benefits of ex-spouses; and to establish procedures for election ties.

Ordinance No. 25956

Appropriating \$56,000 from the Vehicle License Fee Fund for reimbursement of costs for a Transportation Circulation and Access Study and authorizing the execution of an agreement with the Port of Tacoma for said purpose.

Ordinance No. 25957

Amending the Biennial Budget for fiscal years 1995-1996 to increase the Graphic Services Operating Fund, Central Stores Fund, Equipment Rental Capital Outlay Fund, and Human Resources Management System Acquisition/Implementation Fund; and declaring an emergency making necessary the passage of this ordinance.

REPORTS BY CITY MANAGER

City Manager Ray E. Corpuz requested an Executive Session to discuss potential litigation, not to exceed 30 minutes.

COMMENTS AND COMMITTEE REPORTS OF CITY COUNCIL

Council Member Miller thanked the City Manager and staff for removing the political signs that were placed illegally. He indicated that there are many more intersections that need to be addressed regarding the placement of political signs. Council Member Miller proposed that the City of Tacoma have available a letter detailing the legal responsibilities for sign placement, including the \$25 fine for failure to observe the ordinance. He stated that he will continue to push for imposing the fine if the candidates do not police themselves. Council Member Miller then requested the locations of the parcels of land being proposed for purchase for open space.

Council Member Evans stated that he would like the size of the political signs to be addressed as well as the placement of the signs. He then thanked the staff for placing the flags behind the dais in the proper order.

Council Member Crowley expanded on comments he made earlier in the meeting regarding traffic on Interstate 5. He stated that he would like to address the issue of large semi-trucks on the freeway. He stated that they seem to be getting bigger, traveling faster and in all lanes on the freeway. Council Member Crowley then stated that he was not sure how we can address this issue on a local level, but encouraged the City and citizens to contact their State Legislature to see if this issue could be addressed.

Council Member De Forrest requested a copy of the Supreme Court ruling regarding the City of Tacoma's sign ordinance. He then reminded everybody that the City Council meeting of September 24, 1996, will be held at the Tacoma Dome Exhibition Hall followed by the Summer Library Reading Awards. He then stated he was looking forward to the award ceremony.

Council Member Kirby also requested a copy of the Supreme Court ruling and the ordinance that addresses political signs in the City. He then requested a response on how the City would enforce the ordinance equally and what would happen if it was not enforce equally.

Council Member Baarsma stated that he attended the memorial service for Richard Washington, a Tacoma Police Officer and Community Liaison. Council Member Baarsma stated that he was struck with the love and respect that emulated from the community during the service. Council Member Baarsma stated that Mr. Washington was a public servant in the finest sense of the word and that the public truly loved and respected him and the good works that he did.

Mayor Ebersole stated that Council Member Baarsma was referring to Richard Washington, a well-respected Tacoma Police Officer who, at the age of 44, unexpectedly passed away. He stated that Mr. Washington was an asset to our community and then stated that the thoughts of the City Council are with his family.

Council Member De Forrest requested a study session to review the placement of all signs that use the right-of-ways for advertising.

Council Member McGavick stated the City of Tacoma was the recipient of the Deming Award. She indicated that the City will be a test sight for the Deming Institute and that the City will be getting all kinds of technical assistance. Council Member McGavick congratulated Diane Brogden, Grants Coordinator, who wrote the grant, and Genelle Birk, Assistaant City Manager, who was instrumental in bringing the group to the City, as well as Council Members Baarsma, Evans and Crowley.

Council Member Evans moved to convene to Executive Session to discuss potential litigation, not to exceed 30 minutes. Seconded by Deputy Mayor Silas. Voice vote was taken and carried. The motion was declared adopted.

The City Council convened to Executive Session at 6:38 p.m. and reconvened at 6:55 p.m.
