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## COMMENTS AND COMMITTEE REPORTS BY MEMBERS OF THE CITY COUNCIL:

Council Member Hyde reported on a recent conference in Seattle regarding Puget Sound waters which he attended. He stated that the information conveyed will help with the decisions pertaining to Commencement Bay.

Council Member Hyde moved to suspend the rules to consider new matters. Seconded by Council Member Rasmussen. Voice vote was taken and carried. The motion was declared adopted.

Council Member Hyde moved that the City Manager and the Civic Arts Commission be directed to withhold any further actions, in accordance with the provisions of the 1% for the Arts Ordinance, involving the selection or commissioning of public works of art which includes a contribution of City funds in excess of \$5,000, provided, however, that the artwork presently being considered for the Police Department Remodeling Program be excluded from this prohibition. Such a delay shall remain in effect pending the completion of a study to the provisions of the 1% for the Arts Ordinance and City Council action, if any, on the study's recommendations, or until June 30, 1985, whichever is sooner.

Roll call vote was taken, resulting as follows:

Ayes: 6 - Hyde, Ladenburg, Rasmussen, Stenger, Warnick, and Mayor Sutherland.

Navs: 3 - Bichsel, Kirby, and Strege.

The motion was declared adopted.

Mayor Sutherland stated that Thursday, November 15, 1984 will be the American Cancer Society's Great American Smoke-Out and urged smokers to refrain from smoking on that day.

Mayor Sutherland moved to recess to Executive Session to discuss legal matters. Seconded by Council Member Warnick. Voice vote was taken and carried. The motion was declared adopted.
