Amending Chapter 13.06 of the Official Code to reclassify the property located approximately 50 feet south of the southeast corner of Center and Gunnison Streets from an "R-2SRD" Residential Special Review District to a "C-1" Commercial District to allow construction of a two-story retail commercial and general office building. (D. C. Kim; File No. 120.1181)

Amending Chapter 12.06 of the Official Code to add a new Section 12.06.270 relative to time-of-day off-peak electric energy regulations and rates.

Amending Title 6 of the Official Code to reduce the electrical gross earnings tax rate and the natural gas gross earnings tax rate from 7.0% to 6.8% effective January 1, 1987.

Ordinance No. 23739

Amending the Pay and Compensation Plan to establish rates of pay for the training positions of Water Service Aide and Electrical Service Aide and modifying funeral leave provisions.

The Ordinance was set over for final reading next week.

Authorizing the acquisition of 192.8 acres of forest land located 1.5 miles southeast of Baring, Washington on the South Fork of the Skykomish River for \$170,000.00 to be exchanged with the U.S. Forest Service for property in the Green River Watershed.

Deputy Mayor Rasmussen moved that the Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Council Member Warnick. Voice vote was taken and carried. The Resolution was declared adopted.

## Resolution No. 29396

Authorizing the acquisition of 200 acres of forest land located one mile west of Stevens Pass for \$300,000.00 to be exchanged with the U.S. Forest Service for property in the Green River Watershed.
