Amending Chapter 2.02 of the Official Code by repealing Sections 2.02.810 through 2.02.930; and adding Chapter 2.13 to be known as the Waterfront Structure and Marina Code to establish new criteria to augment the Building Code in regulating the construction of dry boat storage and marinas.

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Authorizing the execution of a grant agreement with the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development in the amount of \$60,000; and depositing in and appropriating said sum from the Miscellaneous Grants Summary Fund to implement projects in the 1992 Emergency Shelter Grant Program.

Ordinance No. 25089

Authorizing the sale and issuance of Electric System Refunding Revenue Bonds in the amount of \$70,000,000 for advance refunding of certain maturities of 1986 and 1988 Bonds; and authorizing the execution of an escrow agreement for said purpose.

The Ordinance was set over for final reading next week.

Authorizing the execution of an agreement with The Greater Tacoma Community Foundation for development and construction of the Broadway Theater.

The Purchase Resolution, including Substitute Exhibit A and excluding Item No. 6, was declared adopted.

Resolution No. 31701

Amending Resolution No. 31271 to add a representative from the youth community to serve on the Citizens Recognition Committee.

Deputy Mayor Mykland moved that the Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Council Member Nielsen. Voice vote was taken and carried. The Resolution was declared adopted.

Resolution No. 31702

Extending the effective date of the "Interim Urban Design Policies" until the modification of the "Generalized Land Use Plan" has been completed or until December 31, 1993.

Deputy Mayor Mykland moved that the Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Council Member Miller. Voice vote was taken and carried. The Resolution was declared adopted.

Resolution No. 31703

Designating the Director of Finance to make declarations of official intent for the expenditures for capital projects as necessary and in compliance with the requirements of Treasury Regulation Section 1.103-18.

Deputy Mayor Mykland moved that the Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Council Member Silas. Voice vote was taken and carried. The Resolution was declared adopted.

Matt and Cheryl Guss, appellants, presented their reasons for the appeal.

Mr. John Kautz and Ms. Kim Abrose, Attorney for Mr. Kautz, spoke in support of the Hearings Examiner's decision.

Deputy Mayor Mykland moved to concur in the Findings, Conclusions and Recommendations of the Hearings Examiner and deny the appeal. Seconded by Council Member Silas. Voice vote was taken and carried. The motion was declared adopted.
