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## FINAL READING OF ORDINANCES:

Ordinance No. 23074 (Continued from the meeting of December 13, 1983.)

Adopting the annual budget of the City of Tacoma for 1984.

Mayor Sutherland moved to suspend the rules to consider Ordinance No. 23074 - Substitute No. 2. Seconded by Councilwoman Bichsel. Voice vote was taken and carried. The motion was declared adopted.

Mayor Sutherland moved that the General Fund 1984 Preliminary Budget of \$67,337,991 be further adjusted as follows: That the revenues as indicated be increased to a total of \$67,693,703.00, the expenditures be increased an equivalent amount to a total of \$67,693,703.00, and, further, that the note as on the dais be attached as an attachment to the ordinance. Seconded by Councilman Rasmussen. Voice vote was taken and carried. The motion was declared adopted.

Roll call vote was taken on the ordinance, as amended, resulting as follows:

Ordinance No. 23080

Amending the Pay and Compensation Plan to implement 1984 rates of pay for unrepresented classifications.

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Deputy Mayor Nielsen moved to amend Section 2, page 10, to read as follows: "that the amendments to the Compensation Plan contained herein shall be effective January 1, 1984." Seconded by Councilman Ladenburg. Voice vote was taken and carried. The motion was declared adopted.

Mayor Sutherland moved to further amend the ordinance to add that the changes in compensation contained herein shall be effective January 1, 1984, and that under the Charter of the City of Tacoma, ordinances do not become effective until ten days after publication unless passed as emergency measures; That in order for this ordinance to become effective prior to January 1, 1984, in accordance with the prior motion, an emergency is hereby declared to exist making necessary the passage of this ordinance and its taking effect immediately upon publication. Seconded by Deputy Mayor Nielsen. Voice vote was taken and carried. The motion was declared adopted.

Roll call vote was taken on the ordinance, as amended, resulting as follows:

Ordinance No. 23081 (Continued from the meeting of December 20, 1983.)

Amending the Pay and Compensation Plan to implement 1984 rates of pay in accordance with negotiated contracts.

Mayor Sutherland moved to amend Ordinance No. 23081 as follows:

On line 5 of page 1, the title is amended in part to provide "and declaring an emergency making necessary the passage of this ordinance, and its taking effect immediately upon publication"; and amending Section 5 on page 9 as follows:

"That the changes in compensation contained herein shall be effective January 1, 1984 unless otherwise indicated"; also adding a new Section 6 on page 9 reading as follows:

"That under the Charter of the City of Tacoma, ordinances do not become effective until ten days after publication unless passed as emergency measures:

"That in order for this ordinance to become effective prior to January 1, 1984, in accordance with the labor agreements, an emergency is hereby declared to exist making necessary the passage of this ordinance and its taking effect immediately upon publication." Seconded by Deputy Mayor Nielsen. Voice vote was taken and carried. The motion was declared adopted.

Roll call vote was taken on the Ordinance, as amended, resulting as follows:

Amending the Official Code to update the Boiler and Pressure Vessel Code.

Authorizing the execution of grant award contracts in the amount of \$95.618.00 with the Federal Aviation Administration and \$5,312.00 with the Washington State Department of Aeronautics; and appropriating \$100,930.00, or so much thereof as may be necessary, from the Airport Fund for updating the Master Plan for the Tacoma Narrows Airport.

Amending Section 1 of Ordinance No. 23061 which relates to Electrical Energy Regulations and revises Schedule A-1 to incorporate a rate for low-income and elderly citizens.

Ordinance No. 23094

Appropriating the sum of \$5,794.28, or so much thereof as may be necessary, from the Tacoma Dome Operating Fund for temporary, emergency repairs to the Tacoma Dome roof, and declaring an emergency, making necessary the passage of this ordinance and its taking effect immediately upon publication.

Roll call vote was taken, resulting as follows:

Councilman Rasmussen moved that the Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Councilwoman Bichsel. Voice vote was taken and carried. The Resolution was declared adopted.

## Resolution No. 28160

Authorizing the execution of a personal services contract with Shapiro & Associates, Inc. for an energy conservation assessment of the commercial and industrial sectors in the greater Tacoma-Pierce County area.

Deputy Mayor Nielsen moved that the Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Councilwoman Bichsel. Voice vote was taken and carried. The Resolution was declared adopted.

## Resolution No. 28161

Retaining the law firm of Preston, Thorgrimson, Ellis & Holman as Bond Counsel to perform legal services related to the sale of 1984 Sewer Revenue Bonds.

Deputy Mayor Nielsen moved that the Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Councilwoman Bichsel. Voice vote was taken and carried. The Resolution was declared adopted.

### Resolution No. 28162

Retaining the firm of McLean & Company to provide financial advisory services relative to the sale of 1984 Sewer Revenue Bonds.

Councilwoman Bichsel moved that the Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Councilman Hyde. Voice vote was taken and carnied. The Resolution was declared adopted.

## Resolution No. 28163

Providing for retroactive wage adjustments for unrepresented employees.

Deputy Mayor Nielsen moved to remove Resolution No. 28163 from the agenda. Seconded by Councilman Hyde. Roll call vote was taken, resulting as follows: Ayes: 5 - Bichsel, Hyde, Ladenburg, Strege, and Mayor Sutherland. Nays: O. Absent: 2 - Kirby and Rasmussen. Present and not voting: 2 - Hawkins and Nielsen.
