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Section 8.1 - Every grant, renewal, extension, or amendment of a franchise, right or privilege. shall be by ordinance which shall not be passed before the second regular meeting of the Council, and at least fifteen days after its introduction. nor become effective except in the case of initiative or referendum, until thirty days after publication thereof, and which, whether it is so provided therein or not, shall be subject to the right of the Council or the qualified electors of the city acting for themselves by the initiative or referendum, unless otherwise provided by law, at any time subsequent to the grant, renewal, extension, or amendment...

Ordinance No. 23128

REPORTS BY CITY MANAGER:

Erling O. Mork, City Manager, stated that the Personnel/Labor Relations Director, Richard Sokolowski, had two residency waivers to present to the Council.

Richard Sokolowski, Personnel/Labor Relations Director, then stated that he needed a residency waiver for the unclassified, appointive position of Municipal Court Bailiff for Mr. Joseph R. Gratchner.

Council Member Rasmussen moved to grant the residency waiver for Joseph R. Gratchner. Seconded by Council Member Ladenburg. Voice vote was taken and carried. The motion was declared adopted.

Richard Sokolowski then stated that he needed a residency waiver for the unclassified, appointive position of City Attorney for Mr. Robert R. Backstein.

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Council Member Warnick moved that the residency waiver be approved, with the condition that Mr. Backstein become a resident within the corporate city limits of the City of Tacoma within one year. Seconded by Council Member Bichsel. Voice vote was taken and carried. The motion was declared adopted.

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COMMENTS AND COMMITTEE REPORTS BY MEMBERS OF THE CITY COUNCIL:

Council Member Hyde indicated there was a need for lighting at the boat launching area at Point Defiance and he requested that staff contact the Metropolitan Park Department personnel regarding this matter.

Council Member Warnick expressed concerns regarding the Council's level of involvement in the Utility Board decision-making process. He stated that he would not be attending tomorrow's joint Public Utility Board/Council Study Session, and further requested a Council Study Session on this matter.

Council Member Warnick then expressed concerns regarding levels of compensation being paid in the City and requested a resolution that asked for a study by an outside agency to review the compensation level paid to staff compared to other government agencies and municipalities.

Council Member Warnick requested that City staff investigate levels of compensation for females and study ways that the City might bring about comparable levels of pay for females in the City. He further requested that staff investigate parity of pay and opportunities and look for methods to improve the City's record.

Council Member Rasmussen moved to recess to Executive Session to discuss personnel matters. Seconded by Deputy Mayor Strege. Voice vote was taken and carried. The motion was declared adopted.

Council recessed to Executive Session at 6:47 p.m. and reconvened at 6:58 p.m.
