Mayor Johnston, Secretary of the Association of Washington Cities Board of Directors, commented on a recent meeting of the Board and a communication to Council regarding serving on the National League of Cities Policy Committee. He reported that Mr. Warnick had requested appointment to the Human Resources Committee and Mr. Sonntag to the Manpower and Income Support Committee and that the appointments have been confirmed by the Board and forwarded to the National League of Cities.

Mr. Strege reported on the meeting between Council representatives and the Tacoma School District, where the subjects of discussion were the Drug Abuse Program, the proposed closure of North "E" Street and the possibility of enlarging the seating capacity of Stadium Bowl. He also reported the School Board complimented the Council for support of the Baker School evening program. Mr. Strege also commented on the cooperation of Firefighters Union Local 31 with the citizens committee regarding the passage of the Fireboat Bond.
