(Department of Public Works; File No. 124.935)

Amending Chapter 1.12 of the Official Code relative to Subsection 1.12.155 of the Pay and Compensation Plan to authorize the funding of temporary employees with state or other governmental funds.

Repealing Sections 3, 4 and 5 of Ordinance No. 23417, amending Sections 3, 4 and 5 of Ordinance No. 15928 and adding Section 8 entitled "LIMITED TERM GENERAL OBLIGATION (LTGO) BOND DEBT" effective August 1, 1991.

Member Miller requested the task force to quantify the definition of "junk" vehicle. Council Member Evans requested that the task force continue to examine the other kinds of eyesores such as boats for sale, nonestablished businesses and political signs on public property.
