Resolution No. 32599

Authorizing the submittal of a loan application to the Washington State Department of Community Development in the amount of \$1,794,700 for for the reconstruction of Taylor Way between East 11th Street and Lincoln Avenue.

Mayor Moss moved that the Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Council Member McGavick. Voice vote was taken and carried. The Resolution was declared adopted.

Resolution No. 32600

Approving the issuance of revenue bonds by the Pierce County Economic Development Corporation in an amount not to exceed \$2,500,000 for T.C. Products, Inc. to finance a new facility for manufacturing bleach and other cleaning products.

Deputy Mayor Miller moved that the Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Council Member Silas. Voice vote was taken and carried. The Resolution was declared adopted.

Council Member De Forrest moved to recess for 10 minutes. Seconded by Council Member Kirby. Voice vote was taken and carried. The motion was declared adopted. Council recessed at 7:05 p.m. and reconvened at 7:16 p.m.

REPORTS BY CITY MANAGER:

Ray E. Corpuz, Jr., City Manager, reported that the Council Workshop on May 26, with Bruno Freschi, architect, will be rescheduled to another date.

Mr. Corpuz announced that the first meeting of the Community Council will be held on May 9, at 6:30 p.m., in the Cascade Room, at the Tacoma Main Library. Mr. Corpuz stated the purpose of the meeting is to discuss the duties and responsibilities of the Community Council. He encouraged Council Members to attend.

COMMENTS AND COMMITTEE REPORTS OF CITY COUNCIL:

Deputy Mayor Miller announced that in last week's Friday Letter, there was a list of 50 businesses who contributed to the gun buy-back program. Deputy Mayor Miller expressed his appreciation for those businesses who supported this program.

Deputy Mayor Miller noted that staff was slipping into old habits on how to address the Council (i.e. "Mr. Mayor, Council Members, Mr. Crowley").

Deputy Mayor Miller requested staff to look into alternatives regarding the audio sound system in the Council Chambers and its transmission. Deputy Mayor Miller indicated that there seems to be a lag in the audio transmission over the Municipal Channel.

Deputy Mayor Miller moved to excuse Mayor Moss from the earlier part of tonight's meeting. Seconded by Council Member De Forrest. Voice vote was taken and carried. The motion was declared adopted.

Council Member Silas expressed concern that the Citizens' Forum is intended for the Council to listen to what the people want to speak about, whether the Council likes it or not. Council Member Silas also noted that if speakers will be limited to three minutes, then Council Rule 10(B) should reflect a three-minute limitation per speaker.

Council Member Silas thanked staff for their efforts in working on cleaning up the Hilltop area. Council Member Silas indicated that alternative methods must be found to keep the area clean.

Council Member Kirby expressed concern about the dialogue between the Council and citizens during Citizens' Forum. Council Member Kirby indicated that the dialogue tonight may prevent citizens from participating and that the Council should allow citizens to just speak.

Council Member Kirby noted that he had recently received mail from Senator Slade Gorton addressed to Council Member McGavick at his home address. Council Member McGavick expressed assurance that she lived in the north end and not the south end.

Council Member De Forrest reported that in a recent news release on the Planning Commission vacancies, the boundaries for District No. 3 was incorrect.

Council Member De Forrest requested the names of the individuals who owned Albers Mill and requested staff to provide an estimate on what the environmental cleanup costs would be for the site. Council Member De Forrest indicated that if the property is appraised at \$450,000, it does not include the environmental cleanup; and if the cost for the site is \$500,000, then does this constitute a gift of public funds.

Council Member De Forrest requested Finance staff to provide a total of the City's outstanding bonds, including the bonds of Public Utilities and their debt service.

Council Member De Forrest requested staff to respond to Mr. Binkley's letter regarding restitution.

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In reference to the Emmanuel Church appeal, Council Member De Forrest noted that it was his hope that the Council would consider the motion to reconsider so that the parties involved could have resolved the issue.

Council Member Evans spoke regarding recent articles in the *Morning News Tribune* on growth management overlaps. He requested staff to provide the points of contention between the County and the City.

On proper motion, the meeting was adjourned at 8:30 p.m.
