Jean Matley, representing the Upper Tacoma Renaissance Association, requesting to speak concerning crime in the "K" Street Business District.

Jean Matley, Upper Tacoma Renaissance Association, spoke to the Council regarding the problem of crime in the "K" Street area.

Also speaking to the Council relative to this problem were: Ray Manning, 1922 North Prospect; Helen Ritts, Helen Ritts Insurance; and Ken Pounds, UTRA. Mr. Pounds also presented citizens' petitions to the City Council regarding this problem.

Mr. Pounds requested stronger ordinances to deal with the crime and nuisance problems in the "K" Street area and assistance from the Pierce County Prosecutor's Office relative to this problem.
