Mrs. Weydt, 715 East 37th, and Amos Wilson, 3639 McKinley Avenue, requested that East 37th from McKinley Avenue to East "D" and East 37th from East "D" to East "E" Street be reinstaged into the L.I.D.

Ron Button, Director of Public Works, advised Council that the School District is the largest property owner on the street and they remained neutral on the L.I.D. Therefore, as the largest property owner, the percentage in favor of the L.I.D. was only 41 percent.

Ordinance No. 20805 Amending Chapter 6.35 of the Official Code relating to picture machines by adding a new section to be known as 6.35.035, accessibility of viewing areas.

The Ordinance was set over for final reading next week.

Ordinance No. 20806 Amending the Official Code by repealing and reenacting Sections 1.42.050 through 1.42.080 and by adding thereto a new Chapter consisting of ten sections to be known as Chapter 13.07, relative to historic landmarks.

Patty Sias, Historic Preservation Officer, explained the Ordinance to Council and answered questions.

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Dr. Hruza, Chairman of the Landmarks Preservation Commission answered questions of Council.

Art Sholnik, State Conservator, State Historic Preservation Officer and Executive Director of the State Advisory Council on Historic Preservation, answered questions of Council regarding the current use assessment on the different properties and other related tax laws on historic properties.

The Ordinance was set over for final reading next week.

Ordinance No. 20807 Repealing and reenacting Chapter 1.29 of the Official Code relating to Human Relations Commission.

Mayor Johnston announced that as a result of the Study Session, he would move to remove the ordinance from the agenda. Seconded by Mr. Nielsen. Voice vote was taken and carried. The Ordinance was removed from the agenda.

Ordinance No. 20808 Amending Section 12.06.290 of the Official Code relative to street lighting and traffic signal rate, Schedule H-1.

The Ordinance was set over for final reading next week.

Ordinance No. 20809 Amending Chapter 13 of the Official Code by creating a new Chapter to be known as Chapter 13.12 "Environmental Code" and declaring an emergency making necessary the passage of this Ordinance and its taking effect immediately upon publication.

The Ordinance was set over for final reading next week.

Ordinance No. 20810 Amending the Pay and Compensation Plan relative to holidays and changes in rates of pay for certain classifications.

The Ordinance was set over for final reading next week.

Ordinance No. 20811 Authorizing amendment to the Grant Agreement with theNational Science Foundation to accept the sum of \$40,000.00 and appropriating said funds for the purpose of continuing the Totem One Project through May 31, 1977.

The Ordinance was set over for final reading next week.

Ordinance No. 20812 Vacating a portion of Tyler Street and the alley north of South 30th Street. (Norman E. Wall)

Robert Backstein, Hearings Examiner, requested that under his recommendations, conclusion number 4.a., that it be amended to read as follows: "Easements shall be retained for now existing sewer and power lines in the area, as well as an existing water line and fire hydrant to be placed upon the construction of the apartments".

Mr. Schroeder moved that the amendment be made. Seconded by Mr. Warnick. Voice vote was taken and carried.

The Ordinance was set over for final reading to a date to be determined.

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Ordinance No. 20813

Amending Chapter 13.06 of the Official Code to reclassify the west side of South Tyler between South 30th Street and SR-16 from an "R-3" to an "R-4-L" District. (Jacobson & Wall, Architects)

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The Ordinance was set over for final reading to a date to be determined.

Ordinance No. 20814

Amending Chapter 13.06 of the Official Code to reclassify the property from Karl Johan Avenue to the Tacoma Narrows and between Olympic Boulevard and Sixth Avenue from an "R-1" to an "R-3-PRD" District. (Property Holding & Development, Inc.)

Mr. Backstein reviewed the area of the request and explained the different types of units to be built upon the property. He advised there would be a total of 550 units initially, and another 550 units would be built after 10 years. The first year there would be 110 units built. He answered questions of Council members and reported that no appeal had been filed.

The Ordinance was set over for final reading to a date to be determined.

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Mr. Nelson moved to suspend the rules to consider item (e) under communications of June 2 1976, where the Hearings Examiner recommended that the Street Vacation Request No. 124.534 of the City of Tacoma Community Development Department for vacation of a portion of Pacific Avenue and South 12th Street be denied. Seconded by Mr. Warnick. Roll call vote was taken on the motion, resulting in Ayes: 5 - Hudson, Nelson, Schroeder, Warnick, and Mayor Johnston. Nays: 3 - Bichsel, Nielsen, Strege. Absent: 1 - Sonntag. The motion carried.

Mr. Nelson moved to reconsider the street vacation and to overrule the recommendation of the Hearings Examiner and grant the street vacation. Seconded by Mr. Warnick. Roll call vote was taken, resulting in Ayes: 5 - Hudson, Nelson, Schroeder, Warnick and Mayor Johnston. Nays: 4 - Bichsel, Nielsen, Sonntag, Strege. The motion carried.

Authorizing the City to enter into an affiliation agreement with the Comprehensive Mental Health Center of Tacoma-Pierce County for operation of the Southend Youth Services Bureau.

Mr. Hudson moved that the Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Mr. Nelson. Voice vote was taken and carried. The Resolution was declared adopted.

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HEARINGS & APPEALS: This is the date set for hearing the Amended Six-Year Comprehensive Street Program for 1977 through 1982 and Amended Six-Year Program for Arterial Street Construction.

Ron Button, Director of Public Works, advised Council that the hearing had been advertised as required by law. Mr. Button reviewed the Six-Year program and answered questions of Council members.

Members of the public speaking were: Arlene Gainer, speaking for Mrs. Anna Munoz, 912 South 92nd Street. Mrs. Gainer read a statement written by Mrs. Munoz which requested that the 84th Street arterial from Alaska to Yakima be improved sooner than the planned date of 1981. She pointed out the traffic hazard to pedestrian school children along the road.

Also speaking was Mrs. Rose Poore, 764 South 93rd Street, who urged the 84th Street arterial be improved prior to 1981.

No other citizens appeared to speak at the hearing. Mr. Sonntag moved that the Plan be adopted. Seconded by Mr. Strege. Roll call vote was taken, resulting in Ayes: 9 - Bichsel, Hudson, Nelson, Nielsen, Schroeder, Sonntag, Strege, Warnick and Mayor Johnston. Nays: 0. The Hearing was declared closed.

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UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

a. L.I.D. Committee recommending that L.I.D. 5564 for constructing water mains in Bell Street from South 43rd to South 50th; South 50th from Bell to "A"' and South 45th from Pacific Avenue to "A" Street not be created.

Mayor Johnston moved to concur in the recommendation of the L.I.D. Committee and remove the item from the agenda. Seconded by Mr. Sonntag. Voice vote was taken and carried.

> b. L.I.D. Committee recommending that L.I.D. 3768 for constructing sanitary sewers in Shorecliff Drive from Brown's Pt. Blvd. northeasterly approximately 1550 feet not be created.

Mayor Johnston moved to concur in the recommendation of the L.I.D. Committee and remove the item from the agenda. Seconded by Mr. Sonntag. Voice vote was taken and carried.

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REPORTS BY CITY MANAGER:

Erling Mork advised that he would be bringing back to Council Alternate No. 1 on Resolution 23991, which is on the 12th Street Mini-Park. He also reported that the Cheney Foundation recently awarded the City of Tacoma \$10,000 for the development of the exhibit in the Bicentennial Pavilion.

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COMMENTS BY MEMBERS OF THE CITY COUNCIL:

Mayor Johnston appointed Deputy Mayor Warnick, Councilman Hudson and himself as members of the L.I.D. Committee for the months of July, August and September.

Mayor Johnston complimented Mr. Mork and his staff for the excellent manner in which they prepared the necessary details for the dedication of the Bicentennial Pavilion on Friday, July 2nd.

Mr. Sonntag called attention to Rule 7 of the Council Rules of Procedure regarding filing of new matter and recommended that staff become familar with this rule.

On proper motion, the meeting adjourned at 8:17 p.m.
